I, the undersigned, state the following facts known by me, or told to me by other reliable persons, form the basis for my belief the Defendant committed the crime of:

Murder 1st Degree

On Monday, 03-06-17, Marissa Kilgore went to 114 N. 5th Street to check on her friend Kevin Lambert because he was not answering her phone calls during the day. Kilgore attempted to open the front door but the door was locked. Kilgore entered the house through the unlocked back door and found Lambert sitting in a chair unresponsive. Kilgore called a friend and then thought something was wrong and immediately called 911. In reviewing the call log from the Clinton County Communications, Kilgore called 911 at 1508 hours.

Emergency personnel responded to 114 N. 5th Street and found two adult males deceased inside the house. The males were identified as Kevin Lambert (05-29-59) and Steven Cox (12-28-56).

Officers secured the scene and an investigation started into the death of Lambert and Cox. During the investigation it was discovered that both Lambert and Cox had apparent stab wounds which likely caused their deaths. Officers began a neighborhood canvass and identified two homes in the area with video surveillance cameras on the outside of their homes. Officers located one camera at 508 1st Avenue, the home of Joshua Shaw, which had three surveillance cameras on his garage. Shaw's garage shares the same alley that travels west from N. 5th Street to Fayette and two of his cameras point in the direction of 114 N. 5th Street. The second video surveillance cameras were located at 512 1st Avenue, the home of Randy Brockman. Both Shaw and Brockman agreed to let me copy their surveillance video.

After making a copy of the surveillance video, I began watching the video starting at approximately 1100 hours on 03-04-17. From this video I was able to identify several times throughout the day that Lambert comes and goes from his residence. I was also able to identify the time that Cox returns home. As I continued to view the video, at approximately 15:59 hours on 03-04-17 two unknown males walking north on N. 5th Street go to the front of the house. One is a white male and the other is a black male. These two males (one black, one white) leave the house at approximately 16:33 hours and walk west through the alley towards Fayette Street. The white is wearing a black hat, darker jeans, white shoes and a black/grey and white jacket.

The black male is wearing a brown winter hat, brown jacket with white on the inside, blue jeans, white shoes and a black shirt with lettering on the shirt.

From the surveillance video still pictures were made of the white male and black male from when they were seen at 114 N 5th Street. During the investigation, Officers found Lambert liked to drink and he spent time at the River City Brewing Company (RCBC) located at 212 S. 4th Street. Based on this information, Cpl. Crockett went to RCBC on 03-07-17 and met with Derek Brown the manager of the bar.

In trying to identify the two males in the video, Cpl. Crockett had Brown watch a portion of the surveillance video to see if he recognized these two people. Brown stated both have recently been in the bar but he did not know their names. Brown stated he only knew the black male as "Mississippi". While Cpl. Crockett was at the bar, Brown went to review his surveillance video and noticed that on 03-02-17 the black male that he knows as "Mississippi" was in the bar. Brown stated from the video he noticed the large diamond earring that "Mississippi" was wearing and stated that it looked similar to the black male in the video he viewed from Crockett. Brown noticed the earring in both videos.

On 03-08-17 Cpl. Crockett returned to the RCBC and this time he met with bartender, Angela Wallace. Crockett allowed Wallace to view the same surveillance video that Brown watched the day before. Wallace stated she has seen both individuals in the bar but she did not know their names. Wallace stated she knew the black male as "Mississippi". Wallace watched the video from 03-02-17 when Brown stated "Mississippi" was last seen in the bar. Based on the video from RCBC and the surveillance video shown to her by Cpl. Crockett, Wallace stated she was positive the black male was same in both videos. On the same date, 03-08-17, Wallace stated she did not know the name of "Mississippi" but she suggested that we show the video to another patron of the bar who is always at RCBC. Capt. Bohle showed the video to this patron and after watching the video he stated the name of the black male is Steve. The patron did not know Steve's last name but was sure his first name was Steve. From this information, these two males are later identified as Steve Armsted (black male) and Robert Grimes (white male).

Investigators learned that Armsted had a relationship with Alfredia Canady, who at the time of this report lived in Clinton, Iowa. Alfredia is originally from Armsted's hometown in Natchez, Mississippi. Armsted communicated with Alfredia before and after Lambert's and Cox's murders.

On 03-08-17, Officers interviewed Alfredia and discovered that Armsted was with Lambert at his house on Thursday 03-02-17. Mediacom phone records from Lambert's home phone (563-219-8635) showed that on 03-02-17 at approximately 2046 hours a call was made to Alfredia's cell phone. Another call was made to her cell phone at 2047 hours on 03-02-17, again from the home phone of Lambert. Lambert's phone records showed two more calls to Alfredia's cell phone number on 03-03-17. The first call was at 0033 hours and only lasted eleven seconds. The second call was at 0036 hours and lasted approximately thirty-two minutes (32:46). During Cpl. Crockett's interview of Alfredia, she stated that Armsted had called her multiple times. Alfredia stated that she recalled the longer call with Armsted because Armsted needed money from Alfredia so that he could stay at this house. Alfredia agreed to meet with Armsted and she

told Officers that she drove to the Shell Gas station to meet with Armsted. Video surveillance from Downtown Auto captured this meeting with Armsted. Alfredia also reported during this interview that she didn't know Lambert or Cox.

Alfredia also told Officers she had a phone conversation with Armsted on 03-07-17 and during this conversation, Armsted told Canady that he was in trouble. Armsted told Alfredia it was serious and he needed to leave town. According to Alfredia, Armsted sounded terrified. Alfredia also stated that Armsted said that if he was caught he would be going to jail for the rest of his life. Alfredia stated that Armsted planned to go to Davenport to try and take a bus to Mississippi. This phone conversation is a day after Lambert and Cox were found murdered in their home.

In the search of the Mediacom phone records on Lambert's landline, Officers found five other calls to Alfredia (563-559-8448) on 03-04-17 with the last call to Alfredia being made at 2336 hours. Officers noticed an outgoing call from Lambert's phone on 03-04-17 to a Clinton number (563-242-6594). Investigators found this number linked to Francesca Johnson, the wife of a Baptist pastor in Clinton. Johnson was interviewed and she confirmed receiving this particular phone call from Armsted on 03-04-17. Johnson said according to Armsted, he was at a friend's house and needed some money in order to stay for the weekend. To honor Armsted's request, Johnson put \$20 in her mailbox for Armsted to pick up. Johnson noticed the money was gone the next morning.

On 03-09-17 Officers continued to search the area between the victims house at 114 N. 5th Street and 508 2nd Avenue South where Armsted was later located. During this search a knife was found in a plastic city garbage container in the alley behind 534 2nd Avenue S. The large kitchen knife appeared to have blood on the blade. The knife was later sent to the DCI Lab for comparison to known DNA profiles of Lambert and Cox. The DNA profiles on the blade of the knife came back as positive matches to Lambert and Cox.

This location is a direct route south from Fayette Street to the 500 block alley of 2nd Avenue S. During the review of the surveillance video from 508 1st Avenue, the suspect leaves 114 N. 5th Street at approximately 0300 hours on 03-05-17, he travels west in the alley in the direction of Fayette Street and appears to turn south on Fayette. The location of the knife was approximately one block southwest of the Lambert/Cox residence and nine (9) houses west of where Armsted was found at 508 2nd Avenue S.

As I continued to review the surveillance video from Shaw, I noticed at approximately 1321 on 03-04-17 Cox returns home from RCBC and is dropped off in the alley by "On the go Cab". It should be noted that Cox does not leave the house again based on the surveillance video. Throughout the day Lambert is seen leaving the house several times on his bicycle. Lambert is seen returning home at 1538 hours on 03-04-17 and parks his bike at the front of the house. Shortly after Lambert arrives home, at approximately 1559 hours is when Armsted and Grimes are first seen walking into Lambert's house. The video shows Armsted and Grimes leaving Lambert's house at 1633 hours and they walk west in the alley towards Fayette Street.

He is wearing the same clothes he had on when he left earlier in the day and is alone. The Shaw video again show's Lambert leaving the house on his bike at 2047 hours on 03-04-17. Lambert returns home at 2102 hours and based on the video, at this time Lambert, Cox and Armsted are at the house.

The video at this time from Shaw's house is dark and we now are able to track Armsted's movements based video surveillance cameras from Shaw's residence, the video from Downtown Auto and the video from RCBC. From the video from Shaw's residence someone leaves Lambert's house at 2307 hours on 03-04-17 and walks south on N. 5th Street. This person appears to be Armsted, because approximately six minutes later Armsted is seen in the Downtown Auto video walking in front of the Shell Gas Station at 401 2nd Avenue South. During this time Armsted is seen walking between the Shell Gas Station and RCBC several times. The video from RCBC shows Armsted enter the bar for a very short period of time. Armsted stays in this area until 2320 and walks west in the direction of 2nd Avenue South. Again, it should be noted that the clothing and physical description match that of Armsted.

From Shaw's video, approximately six minutes later at 2326 hours on 03-04-17 someone walks north on N. 5th Street going to Lambert's house. Based on all the video we believe this to be Armsted. This would also match the phone records from Lambert's home phone showing calls made to Alfredia starting at 2331 hours on 03-04-17. These calls would have been made by Armsted. This would also match the time Armsted called Johnson (pastors' wife) asking for twenty dollars. The call to Johnson was at 2340 hours on 03-04-17 according to the phone records.

Shaw's video does show Lambert leaves the house one more time at 0015 hours on 03-05-17. Lambert returns home at 0046 hours and is seen walking his bike east in the alley and entering the house. This is the last time Lambert is seen. The last call made from Lambert's landline is at 0156 hours on 03-05-17 and is believed to be made by Lambert to the River City Brewing Company (RCBC).

During the review of home surveillance video, a subject was observed exiting 114 North 5th Street out the south door on 03-05-17, at approximately 3:01 AM. The individual walks west down the alley, right by the video cameras located at 508 1st Avenue and 512 1st Avenue. Although under low light conditions, this person's general appearance / physical descriptors are similar to Armsted. From the video you are able to seen something shine in the right hand of the person walking west in the alley. We know Armsted did not have a cell phone and believe this is the murder weapon.

During the early morning hours on 03-05-17, Armsted made contact on foot with Latoya Coleman in the alley near her house located at 431 5th Avenue South in Clinton. Armsted gave Coleman fifty dollars (\$50) for a drug purchase. After using drugs, Armsted and Coleman went to an ATM machine at the Clinton National Bank where fraudulent deposits were made. The ATM timestamp is 03-05-17, at 5:31 AM. Armsted is seen in this video and again, his general clothing appearance matches that of the person leaving Lambert's house at 0301 hours on the

same day approximately two and half hours earlier. It should be noted that Armsted is not wearing his winter hat at this time and Armsted's hat was found in Lambert's house.

Officers conducted other interviews and learned that Armsted may be trying to leave town to get back to Mississippi. Officers learned during the evening hours on or about 03-07-17, Armsted stopped by Pastor Nathanael and Francesca Johnson's house in Clinton. Among other things, Pastor Johnson said Armsted mentioned he was planning to go back home to Mississippi. Pastor Johnson gave Armsted twenty dollars (\$20) and agreed to give Armsted a ride in the coming days to the bus station in Davenport.

On 03-08-17, Derek Brown, the manager at RCBC called Communications with information that Armsted may be leaving town. Capt. Bohle contacted Brown by phone and Brown said he had information that Armsted is staying at 508 2nd Avenue S. in Clinton, Iowa. Based on this information, Officer went to 508 2nd Avenue S to make contact with Armsted. Armsted was found at this location and Armsted was arrested on a valid warrant not related to this case.

Based on the above information, we know that Armsted was at Lambert and Cox's house on 03-04-17 because his last call to Alfredia was at 2336 hours on 03-04-17. Armsted also called Johnson from Lambert's landline a short time later at 2340 hours asking for twenty dollars. During interviews with Alfredia, she told Investigators that Armsted told her he needed to leave town because he was in serious trouble. Armsted told Alfredia that if he was caught he would go to jail for the rest of his life. Alfredia also tells investigators that Armsted is a knife person and that he is very good at handling knives. Lambert and Cox were murdered with single stab wounds to the chest. A knife was found in a plastic city garbage container in the alley behind 534 2nd Avenue S. The large kitchen knife appeared to have blood on the blade. The knife was later sent to the DCI Lab for comparison to known DNA profiles of Lambert and Cox. The location of the knife was approximately one block southwest of the Lambert/Cox residence and nine (9) houses west of where Armsted was staying at 508 2nd Avenue South.

Armsted is seen throughout the day from video from Shaw, Downtown Auto and RCBC and Armsted's clothing and physical description match the person that leaves Lambert's house at 0301 hours on 03-05-17.

During this search a knife was found in a plastic city garbage container in the alley behind 534 2nd Avenue S. The large kitchen knife appeared to have blood on the blade. The knife was later sent to the DCI Lab for comparison to known DNA profiles of Lambert and Cox. The DNA profiles on the blade of the knife came back as positive matches to Lambert and Cox.

This location is a direct route south from Fayette Street to the 500 block alley of 2nd Avenue S. During the review of the surveillance video from 508 1st Avenue, the suspect leaves 114 N. 5th Street at approximately 0300 hours on 03-05-17, he travels west in the alley in the direction of Fayette Street and appears to turn south on Fayette. The location of the knife was approximately one block southwest of the Lambert/Cox residence and nine (9) houses west of where Armsted was found at 508 2nd Avenue S.

As I continued to review the surveillance video from Shaw, I noticed at approximately 1321 on 03-04-17 Cox returns home from RCBC and is dropped off in the alley by "On the go Cab". It should be noted that Cox does not leave the house again based on the surveillance video. Throughout the day Lambert is seen leaving the house several times on his bicycle. Lambert is seen returning home at 1538 hours on 03-04-17 and parks his bike at the front of the house. Shortly after Lambert arrives home, at approximately 1559 hours is when Armsted and Grimes are first seen walking into Lambert's house. The video shows Armsted and Grimes leaving Lambert's house at 1633 hours and they walk west in the alley towards Fayette Street.

At 1708 hours on 03-04-17 the video shows Armsted returning to 114 N. 5th Street. The video from Shaw's residence shows Armsted walking north on N. 5th Street and walking to the front of the house. He is wearing the same clothes he had on when he left earlier in the day and is alone. The Shaw video again show's Lambert leaving the house on his bike at 2047 hours on 03-04-17. Lambert returns home at 2102 hours and based on the video, at this time Lambert, Cox and Armsted are at the house.

The video at this time from Shaw's house is dark and we now are able to track Armsted's movements based video surveillance cameras from Shaw's residence, the video from Downtown Auto and the video from RCBC. From the video from Shaw's residence someone leaves Lambert's house at 2307 hours on 03-04-17 and walks south on N. 5th Street. This person appears to be Armsted, because approximately six minutes later Armsted is seen in the Downtown Auto video walking in front of the Shell Gas Station at 401 2nd Avenue South. During this time Armsted is seen walking between the Shell Gas Station and RCBC several times. The video from RCBC shows Armsted enter the bar for a very short period of time. Armsted stays in this area until 2320 and walks west in the direction of 2nd Avenue South. Again, it should be noted that the clothing and physical description match that of Armsted.

From Shaw's video, approximately six minutes later at 2326 hours on 03-04-17 someone walks north on N. 5th Street going to Lambert's house. Based on all the video we believe this to be Armsted. This would also match the phone records from Lambert's home phone showing calls made to Alfredia starting at 2331 hours on 03-04-17. These calls would have been made by Armsted. This would also match the time Armsted called Johnson (pastors' wife) asking for twenty dollars. The call to Johnson was at 2340 hours on 03-04-17 according to the phone records.

Shaw's video does show Lambert leaves the house one more time at 0015 hours on 03-05-17. Lambert returns home at 0046 hours and is seen walking his bike east in the alley and entering the house. This is the last time Lambert is seen. The last call made from Lambert's landline is at 0156 hours on 03-05-17 and is believed to be made by Lambert to the River City Brewing Company (RCBC).

During the review of home surveillance video, a subject was observed exiting 114 North 5th Street out the south door on 03-05-17, at approximately 3:01 AM. The individual walks west down the alley, right by the video cameras located at 508 1st Avenue and 512 1st Avenue. Although under low light conditions, this person's general appearance / physical descriptors are similar to Armsted. From the video you are able to seen something shine in the right hand of the person walking west in the alley. We know Armsted did not have a cell phone and believe this is the murder weapon.

During the early morning hours on 03-05-17, Armsted made contact on foot with Latoya Coleman in the alley near her house located at 431 5th Avenue South in Clinton. Armsted gave Coleman fifty dollars (\$50) for a drug purchase. After using drugs, Armsted and Coleman went to an ATM machine at the Clinton National Bank where fraudulent deposits were made. The ATM timestamp is 03-05-17, at 5:31 AM. Armsted is seen in this video and again, his general clothing appearance matches that of the person leaving Lambert's house at 0301 hours on the

same day approximately two and half hours earlier. It should be noted that Armsted is not wearing his winter hat at this time and Armsted's hat was found in Lambert's house.

Officers conducted other interviews and learned that Armsted may be trying to leave town to get back to Mississippi. Officers learned during the evening hours on or about 03-07-17, Armsted stopped by Pastor Nathanael and Francesca Johnson's house in Clinton. Among other things, Pastor Johnson said Armsted mentioned he was planning to go back home to Mississippi. Pastor Johnson gave Armsted twenty dollars (\$20) and agreed to give Armsted a ride in the coming days to the bus station in Davenport.

On 03-08-17, Derek Brown, the manager at RCBC called Communications with information that Armsted may be leaving town. Capt. Bohle contacted Brown by phone and Brown said he had information that Armsted is staying at 508 2nd Avenue S. in Clinton, Iowa. Based on this information, Officer went to 508 2nd Avenue S to make contact with Armsted. Armsted was found at this location and Armsted was arrested on a valid warrant not related to this case.

Based on the above information, we know that Armsted was at Lambert and Cox's house on 03-04-17 because his last call to Alfredia was at 2336 hours on 03-04-17. Armsted also called Johnson from Lambert's landline a short time later at 2340 hours asking for twenty dollars. During interviews with Alfredia, she told Investigators that Armsted told her he needed to leave town because he was in serious trouble. Armsted told Alfredia that if he was caught he would go to jail for the rest of his life. Alfredia also tells investigators that Armsted is a knife person and that he is very good at handling knives. Lambert and Cox were murdered with single stab wounds to the chest. A knife was found in a plastic city garbage container in the alley behind 534 2nd Avenue S. The large kitchen knife appeared to have blood on the blade. The knife was later sent to the DCI Lab for comparison to known DNA profiles of Lambert and Cox. The location of the knife was approximately one block southwest of the Lambert/Cox residence and nine (9) houses west of where Armsted was staying at 508 2nd Avenue South.

Armsted is seen throughout the day from video from Shaw, Downtown Auto and RCBC and Armsted's clothing and physical description match the person that leaves Lambert's house at 0301 hours on 03-05-17.

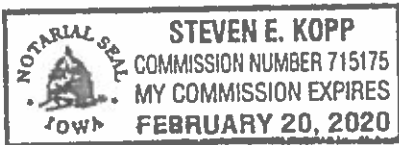
