Britton Deerfield Education Foundation Teacher Mini Grants for 2016/17

Again this year the Britton Deerfield Education Foundation awarded special teacher mini grants. Seven Britton Deerfield teachers were recipients of these grants announced in May. The mini grants are used for extra supplies for the teachers where the school funding is not available. The money can be used for classroom needs including software, art supplies, subscriptions, as well as other items.

Taina Bundshuh to be able to purchase some professional art display walls to be able to show case various art projects around the school.

Heidi Fether for a Brightlink Interactive Projector to be used for the music department in the Deerfield Building. The Lenawee Community Foundation also provided money for this grant.

Elizabeth Richardson for an one year subscription to the unique learning system.

John Eisley to support the Legacy Program in empowerment and peer relations. In sharing for the at risk students, it pairs them with adult advocates.

Vicki Oliver for supplemental material of novels and videos for history through film and literature. LCF also provided grant for this project.
