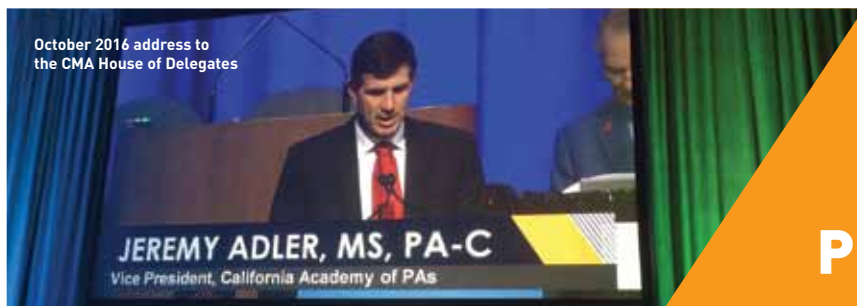

OPTIONAL WORKSHOPS & INTERACTIVE ROUNDTABLE

CAPA's optional hands-on workshops are always popular. CAPA favorite, PA Jennifer Carlquist, will present her comprehensive, 4-hour, **EKG Boot Camp**. Register early for this one! New this year is **Managing Dental Emergencies**. Be sure to read more about that below. Also new this year is an Interactive Roundtable Discussion regarding **Contraception** with Anita Nelson, MD. If you have heard Dr. Nelson's lectures, you know that often you wish you could have some one-on-one time with her to talk about a particular case or issue with which you are struggling. ACLS & BLS RECERTIFICATION

Take your ACLS & BLS Recertification with fellow PAs in a fun, interactive course. Prior certification is required. Note: This course will be up to 6 hours long, so those who attend the ACLS & BLS recertification will not be able to attend the EKG Boot Camp on Thursday afternoon. Lunch will be on your own.

EKG BOOT CAMP

PA Jennifer Carlquist returns for this crowd favorite. This workshop will focus on the high risk EKG that you can't afford to miss. A basic 12-lead review will progress into actual cases we will solve. We will also cover five things you should look for on every EKG of a syncope/palpitations patient and document on their chart. Every participant will also receive an "MI Window" to use in class and take home to use in their clinic while reading EKGs. Practitioners at all levels of EKG interpretation will benefit from this course.

JOINT INJECTION

This workshop is meant for the PA who wishes to gain new experience with joint injections or for the PA who needs to refresh joint injection techniques. Experienced orthopedic PA, Eric Glassman, will provide an overview of types of injection materials, including the efficacy of each type for various orthopedic conditions. Pearls and pitfalls of joint

injections will be reviewed and hands-on practice with anatomical models will allow the participant to progress through various types of common injections used in primary care, rheumatology and orthopedics.

MANAGING DENTAL EMERGENCIES

Dental pain is a common symptom that PAs encounter in daily practice, and dental emergencies can be difficult to manage. This workshop will review methods and techniques that can be used at bedside for dental local anesthesia, as well as tools and innovations available for use by PAs in managing dental pain.
