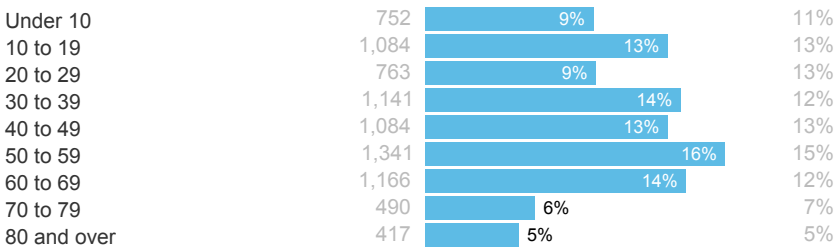

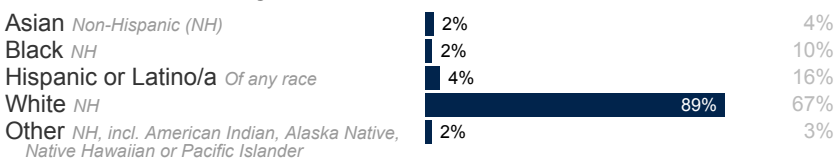

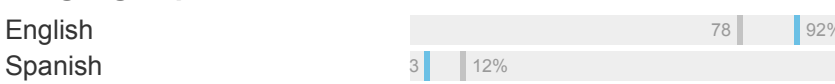
Age Distribution



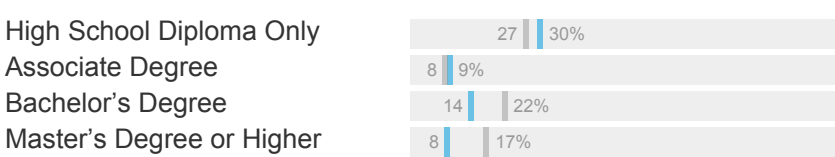
Race and Ethnicity



Language Spoken at Home

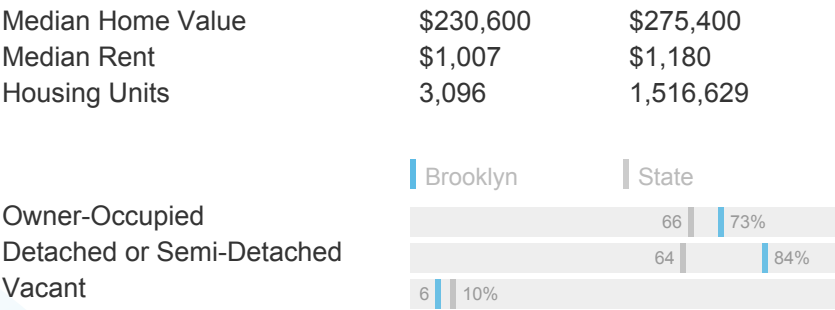


Educational Attainment

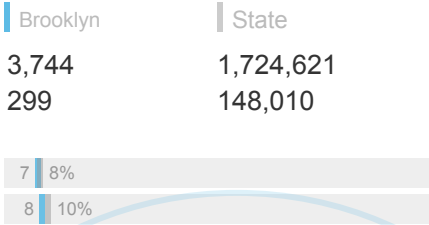

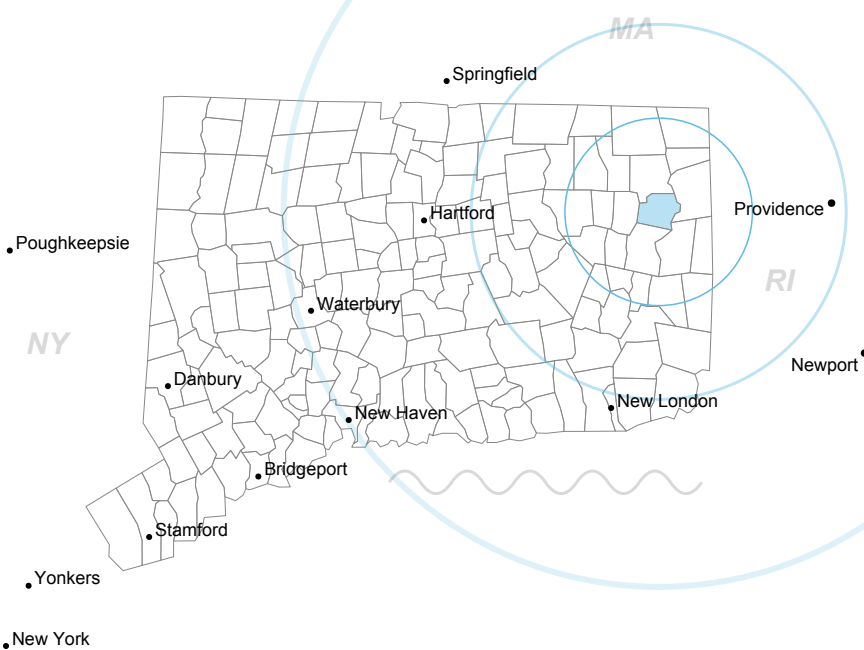

Catchment Areas of 15mi, 30mi, and 60mi

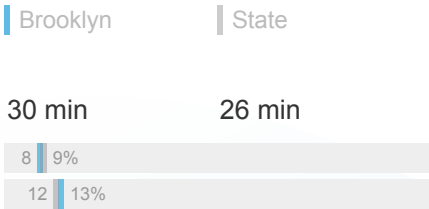
