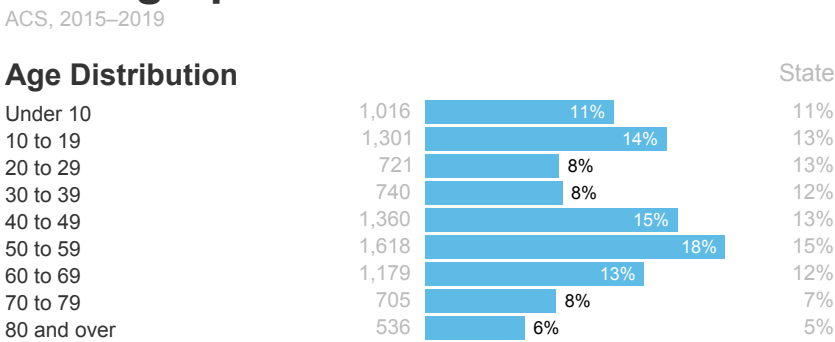

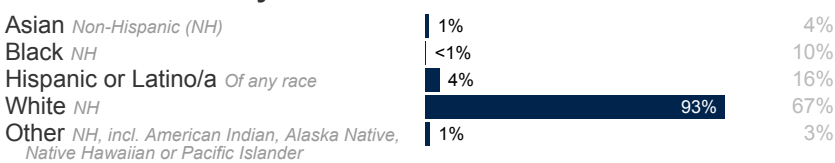

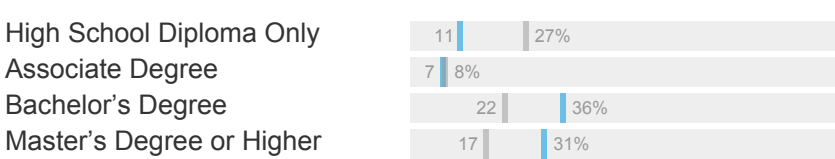

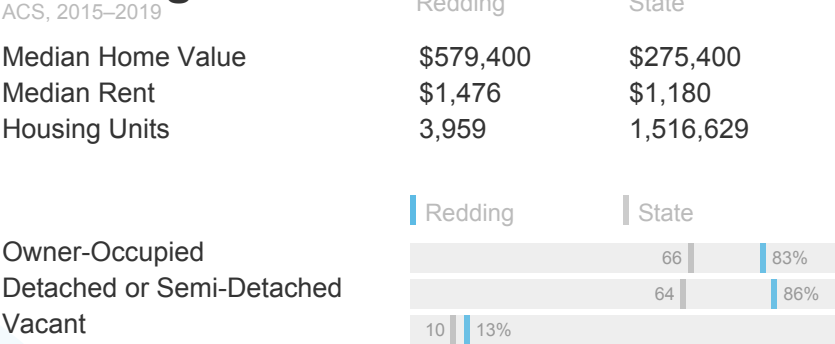

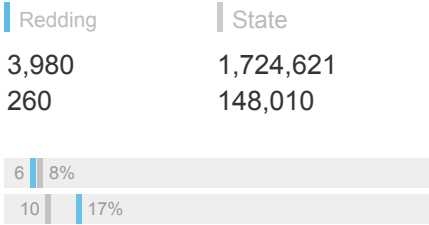

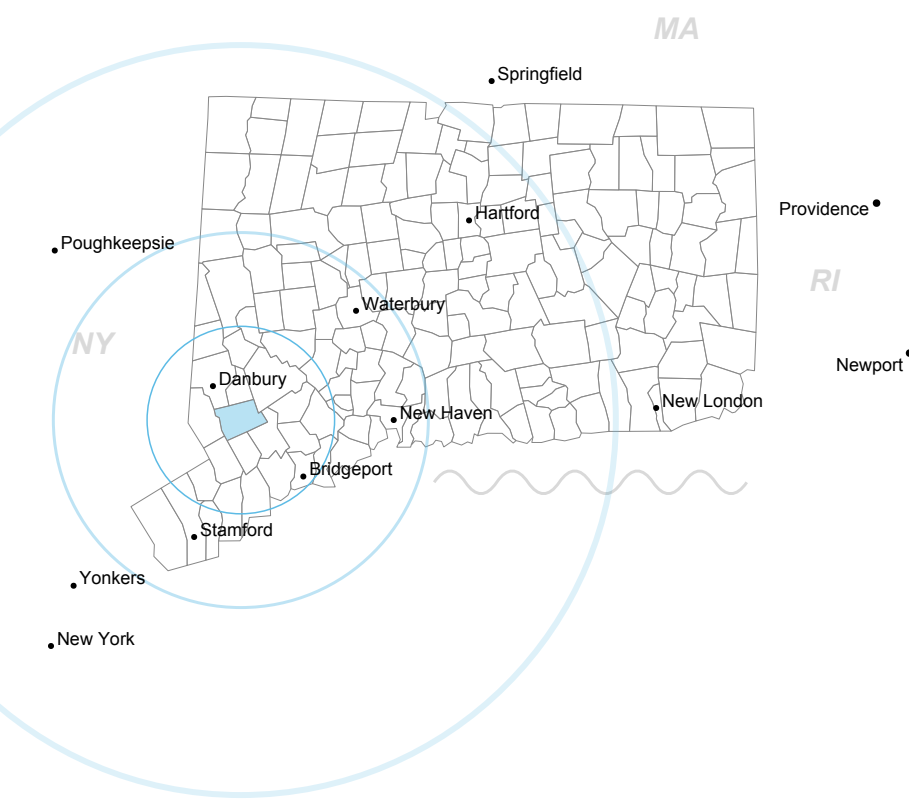
Unemployment Rate

Catchment Areas of 15mi, 30mi, and 60mi



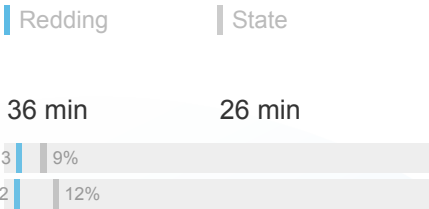
