

Expedition

Camden Hardy

December 13, 2010 – January 5, 2011



On September 17, 2010, Camden Hardy began an expedition of the Pantano Wash. In an attempt to gain a better understanding of the intersection of natural space and social presence, Hardy traversed upstream all 22 miles of the dry riverbed.

From time to time, violent floods force evidence of human interaction downstream. This disruption of the landscape renders interpretation of its cultural history extremely difficult, if not impossible. Through his examination of this strange space, Hardy itemized discarded items, and annotated his experiences.

The photographic artifacts made throughout the expedition represent the end of one mile and the beginning of the next. These offer a contemplative look at many of the unanswered questions that arose regarding the social implications of human presence in the wash.
