Gilgal was established in 2005 when Val Cater, founder and executive director, answered God's call to help homeless women struggling with drugs and alcohol addiction.

Through our one-year, two-phase program, we seek to transition women from crisis and homelessness to stability and independent living.



Driven by a vision to see them break destructive cycles and find victorious living through Jesus Christ, she and her husband Tommy secured property in south Atlanta.

These abandoned buildings, once teeming with drug activity and vagrancy, were reclaimed, renamed and forever changed into what is now a place of healing and hope.

Through our ministry of restoring homeless women with addictions, Gilgal offers clients the chance to embrace a new identity in Christ and become eternally changed through Him.

Gilgal operates three residential recovery homes, as well as one administrative building equipped and staffed to aid women in their recovery.
