



UNIFORMITY

CHECKS & BALANCES

FREQUENT MONITORING

Daily monitoring of grades and proteins, weekly on toxins, among many others

CONSTANT COMMUNICATION

Training, conference calls, emails

INTERNAL AUDIT

Annual audit with strict format to cover processes to ensure quality

COMPLIANCE REVIEW

Minimum once per designation, compliance officers conduct audit



WEIGHING



INDUSTRY EXPECTATIONS

REGISTRATIONS FOR EXPORT

USGSA requires all persons buying grain for sale in EXPORT markets to register with GIPSA.

Exemptions:

- Only occassionally buys
- Only occassionally sells
- Transport grain for hire
- Buys grain for feeding or processing, not resale.

Obtain Certificate



PROHIBITED ACTS

FALSIFY

Official certificates, official mark, knowingly attempt to create, representation, etc.

IMPROPER INFLUENCE

May not improperly influence or attempt to influence official personnel

GRAIN QUALITY

Dockage and FM recombination or addition of either is prohibited

DISGUISE

Contamination of sound and pure grain with nongrain, unfit grain or grain that exceeds FDA Regulations
