So far he talked about his love for UNR, his mission and his passion and experience in leadership. Hopefully they will consider him for the internship. He had a lot of ideas for this school year and those to come.

Wes Fullmer said: Good Evening everyone. I want to thank you all for the opportunity to speak with you tonight. My name is Wes Fullmer and I am a freshman here at the University. I am a pre-med student double majoring in Biology and Spanish Literature and Culture. Am currently serving as Sierra Hall's President and I am in training to become a Student Ambassador for the University. When asked why I was interested in Student Government here at the University, I responded with the statement "I have always loved the atmosphere and responsibilities that are required by those having the position of a student leader. I have always considered myself a leader, however I strive to constantly improve and better myself as a leader in my community and I feel that participating in student government is one of the best way to do that." They had a really big service event and put together care packages to put together toothbrushes, toothpaste, shoes, etc. It was a significant event because they delivered these. A kid literally said "thank you for a toothbrush" and it opened her eyes about the impact they can make. It made her realize how much of a difference they could make and how many people could be helped. She took away that this was what she was meant to do: to make change. Coming in to college she wasn't sure how she was going to do that with classes and the college experience. Joining ASUN would allow her to make a difference.

Heaven Akmal said: Hello, My name is Heaven Akmal. I'm a freshman here at university of Nevada Reno. I'm currently double majoring in theatre and dance and a minor biology, and I am more than thrilled to be a candidate to be a ASUN intern for clubs and organizations. I am from the Las Vegas Valley and student government has always been a huge part of my elementary, middle, and high school experience and I couldn't imagine a fulfilled college experience without being apart of the asun. Currently, I am involved in a copious amount of clubs and organizations on campus ranging from Greek life to theatre. A big part of my high school career was being involved in international thespian society and student council. I feared college would be harder to get involved with but the UNR ASUN clubs and organization program has made it more than accessible to have an awesome, fun filled college experience. I feel that I would be an asset to this internship because I have so much drive and determination to make sure every knows what our clubs and organizations entail, how they can start a club if they don't find one that fits them and the importance of unity between our clubs. As a tier 1 public university, we are lucky enough to have a large amount of funds for our university and our clubs and organizations. One thing I mentioned in my interview was possibly having more than one club fair. Another super cool thing that I think would help our university grow as a community is more club wide events, Making it clear that even though every club is very different we are all here for the same thing, a strong, happy, involved University. One thing I really want to accomplish as an intern this semester is stressing the

fact that you can start your own club. I know for a fact there was one kid who walked through the club fair and didn't feel an attachment to any of the clubs or organizations and he probably wasn't alone. A goal of mine, not exactly just this semester, but eventually throughout my time here at the university of Nevada reno is to make sure there is a club that caters to each and every student on this campus. I'd have to say I am most excited for just getting super involved with all the clubs and organizations and helping all the clubs grow and reach their full potential. Again, thank you for this amazing opportunity and I hope I will be working for you and the board of clubs and organizations in the near future.

Michael Martinelli said: I grew up in Boulder City. It's a pretty small town with a very tight-knit community. There aren't many places you can go that you won't run into one of your classmates, your neighbors, or even the local Judge. So, as you might imagine, coming up here to UNR, where there are about as many people enrolled in classes as there were in my entire hometown, I have had a much different experience to this point. It's a little bit weird for me sitting in lecture halls with 300 kids and going to labs with people I haven't known for the last 15 years, however, the change has been good for me. It is this trust that distinguishes good leaders from great ones. Good leaders might be respected and liked and have complete faith in their people, but great leaders inspire others to trust in themselves. I believe that I have this quality, and I would like to use my experience as a leader to help this organization have a positive impact on this school.

It is the culmination of all the hard work that ASUN puts in throughout the year to make this school a better place. On this campus, as on any campus, learning and leadership must come together to truly make life on campus enriching for everyone. As someone who is accomplished in these two aspects of life, I would be a valuable asset to ASUN in its pursuit of this mission, and I am very excited for the chance to contribute to the energy of the school. I've lived in Nevada my whole life, and, even though both of my parents are UNLV graduates, I am truly happy to be a student here. I care a lot about the people here, and I

look forward to the opportunity to be part of a bigger community. I think that our state song puts it the best: "Home means Nevada to me."
