13 Bazaar Mar by José Andrés

José Andrés' first seafood-centric Bazaar concept, Bazaar Mar, in the trendy SLS Brickell serves creative seafood dishes in a modern, nautical-themed space designed by Philipe Stark. The bounty of the sea dominates the menu, with a seasonal emphasis on Miami and the Caribbean. Standouts include Croquetas de Bacalao (codfish croquettes), ceviches, an extensive raw bar and the California "Funnel Cake" seaweed funnel cake, avocado, blue crab, tobiko, mayo, and cucumber. The restaurant reflects Andres' larger-than-life personality and the menu includes dishes inspired by his motherland including Gambas al Ajillo (sautéed shrimp) and Puntillitas Fritas (baby squid and piparra peppers), which are simply fried just like in southern Spain.
