Our Vision

Twin Falls School District has developed a K-5 Standards-Based Reporting System to better reflect the Idaho Core Curriculum Standards we have adopted and are teaching.

WHY?

 To report progress toward proficiency in meeting state standards in English Language Arts and Mathematics.

How is this different?

Letter grades have been traditionally used to report students' progress. Traditional grading reflects an average on various tasks, rather than designating proficiency toward meeting standards.

Standards-based grading will provide parents and students with information about the student's performance on specific standards as they work on those standards throughout the school year.

What Are the Idaho Core Standards?

Academic content standards indicate what students should know and be able to do, at each grade level, by the end of the school year. The state has adopted this set of shared national learning expectations in Mathematics and Language Arts.

On a standards-based report card each subject area is divided into a list of skills and knowledge that students are responsible for learning. Students receive a separate mark for each standard.

The achievement marks indicate a child's progress toward meeting specific grade level standards.
