

Task 13: Create Project Poster and Prepare to Present at Senior Project Open House.

Senior Project: Life-Ready Leadership in Action

Step 1: Create a Project Poster for your Senior Project Presentation.

Project Poster Guidelines:

Layout:

- The Senior Project Presentation requires trifold poster board.
- The purpose of your poster is to create visual of your Senior Project.
- The title of your project and the Thesis Statement should be prominently and neatly displayed.
- Your name, first and last, should be neatly printed in the lower right corner.
- You should include photos of you completing your project

Craftsmanship:

- Lettering of title should be legible and easily read from at least 20 feet.
- Use correct spelling of all words.
- Images used must be school appropriate.
- If collage is created, paper must be carefully glued down so images remain flat.
- Poster must be smudge- and smear-free.

Considerations:

- Using color blocks, background design or shapes to organize visual elements.
- Overlapping pictures or putting them at angles to create interest.
- Using a combination of large, medium and small shapes within your poster.
- Using computer-generated text which you apply to a poster for a clean, crisp appearance.
- Adding captions of drawings to the visual images.
- Remember that your poster will help create a first impression of your project.

Step 2: Invite your mentor to attend Senior Project Open House.

Students who have their mentor attend will receive a free lunch coupon at a near-by restaurant.

Step 3: Meet the requirements of presenting at Senior Project Open House.

Open House Requirements (See Artifact 13. Senior Project Open House Rubric):

- **Participation:** Presenter must remain at assigned display during entire open house in order to answer questions and practice presenting. Presenter is encouraged to remain standing the entire time, but may sit down when not answering questions. Must stand and greet spectators when they show interest.
- **Project Poster:** Presenter must display a quality project poster (trifold) representing project and any other physical representation of project if possible.
- **Professional Attire:** Presenter must be dressed business-like, professional, compliant with Twin Falls School District Dress Code.
- **Senior Project Portfolio:** Presenter must have the portfolio present at the presentation with the Senior Project Open House Rubric for grading.
