I. Background

OnJune1,2001,theFederalEnergyRegulatoryCommission(CommissionorFERC) issueda"NoticeofPetitionforDeclaratoryOrder"intheabove-referencedproceeding. The NoticestatesthatlicenseePacifiCorpfiledwiththeCommissionapetitionfordeclaratoryorder findingthattheCommissionhasjurisdictiontoentertainandgrantthereliefrequestedin PacifiCorp'spendingapplicationforAmendmentofLicenseandApprovalofOfferof SettlementwhichwasfiledwiththeCommissiononOctober21,1999. TheNoticeestablisheda deadlineforfilingcommentsand/ormotionsat30daysfromthepublicationdateoftheNoticein theFederalRegister(i.e.July20,2001).

II <u>NMFS'Interest</u>

NMFSisafederalagencywithjurisdictionoveranadromousfishresourcesaffectedby thelicensing, operation and maintenance of the Condit Project. See Reorganization Plan No. 4 of 1970,84 Stat. 2090, as a mended; the Federal Power Act (FPA) at 16 U.S.C. § \$803 (j) and 811; and the Fishand Wildlife Coordination Act (FWCA) at 16 U.S.C. § \$661 and 662; the Sustainable Fisheries Act, 16 U.S.C. § \$1801 et seq.; the Pacific Northwest Electric Power Planning and Conservation Act, 16 U.S.C. § \$39 et seq.; and the Pacific Salmon Treaty Act of 1985, 16 U.S.C. § \$3631-3644. The effects of the Projecton passage and flow conditions, habitat, water quality and other effects on an adromous fish resources directly concern NMFS

NMFSalsohasjurisdictionoveranadromousspeciesaffectedbytheConditProjectunder theEndangeredSpeciesAct,(ESA),16U.S.C.§1531 et seq.NMFSlistedtheLowerColumbia RiverEvolutionarilySignificantUnit(ESU)ofsteelheadasathreatenedspeciesundertheESA onMarch19,1998(63Fed.Reg.13347).Inaddition,NMFSlistedLCRspring-runESUof chinooksalmonasanthreatenedspeciesonMarch24,1999(64Fed.Reg.14308).LCR steelheadandchinooksalmonutilizehabitatintheWhiteSalmonRiver,andtheoperationofthe ConditProjectadverselyaffectsthesespeciesbyreducingflowsinthebypassedreach,blocking fishpassagetoupstreamhabitat,andothermeansdecribedmorefullyinthe1996Final EnvironmentalImpactStatement.Implementationoftheproposedsettlementagreement likewisemayhaveeffectsontheselistedspeciesandotheranadromousfishresources(both positiveandnegative),includingthelongtermbeneficialeffectofdamremovalasameasure mostlikelytoachievetherestorationandrecoveryofhealthypopulationsofthesefishwithinthe WhiteSalmonRiverbasin.

Pursuanttotheseauthorities,NMFShasafederalstatutoryresponsibilityforprotection, mitigationandenhancementofanadromousfishresourcesthatwillbedirectlyaffectedbythe outcomeofthisproceeding.Specifically,NMFShasarighttoparticipateconferredbytheFPA andtheFWCA.TheinterestofNMFSasaregulatoryagencywithjurisdictionalresponsibility fortheprotection,mitigationandenhancementofaffectedanadromousfishresourcesisnot adequatelyrepresentedbyanyotherpartyinthisproceeding.Bycarryingoutitsstatutory responsibilitiesundertheFPA,FWCAandotherauthoritiescitedabove,NMFSactsinthe publicinterest.Inaddition,NMFSisobligatedtosatisfyitstribaltrustresponsibilitiesinthe

exerciseofitsstatutoryauthoritiesaffectingtribalinterestsandtribaltreatyobligations

NMFSisaparty/intervenortotheConditrelicensingproceeding,andalsoapartytothe ConditSettlementAgreementcurrentlypendingbeforetheCommission,aswellasandparty/intervenorinthelicenseamendmentproceedingwhichisthesubjectofthependingpetitionfor declaratoryorder. SeeNMFSMotiontoIntervene,FERCNo.2342-011,filedMarch15,2000. Asstatedinourpreviousfilings,NMFSstronglysupportstheSettlementAgreementasthe productofextensive,goodfaithnegotiationleadingtothefairandequitableresolutionofall contestedissuesintheunderlyingrelicensingproceeding.AsareflectionofNMFSstrong interestinresolvingthisproceedingviathependingsettlementagreement,NMFShascontinued toactivelyparticipatedinallproceedingsbeforetheCommission,includingtherecentsitetour andtechnicalconferenceheldonMay17and18,2001.

III. NMFS'PreliminaryPositionandComments

NMFSconcurswiththeanalysisandconclusionsstatedinPacifiCorp'spetition,which are incorporated herein by reference. Specifically, NMFS agrees that various statements made by the Commission's staffatthe May 18,2001 technical conference giver is eto the need for the Commission to clarify that it has authority to extend the term of its license through 2006, and in so doing to incorporate into the license terms and conditions set for thin the Settlement Agreement, including the consensus-based provisions related to project decommissioning the project and removal upon expiration of the extended license. As demonstrated in the Edwards

Damcase cited in the petition (and consistent with the advice provided to the settlement parties by special Commission legal counsel assigned to this project during the recent settlement

negotiations) the Commission has clear jurisdiction and legal authority to approve and implement

the settlementagreement following timely completion of the National Environmental Policy Act

review process. NMFS further agrees with the petitioner that Commission has authority to the commission of the commiss

implementtheagreementbymeansoftherequestedthelicenseamendment, without giving third

parties the opportunity to take over the project, and without requiring the submission of a

surrenderapplication.

IV. Conclusion

Fortheabove-statedreasons, NMFS respectfully requests that its motion to intervene in

this proceeding for the Project begranted, and that the Commission is suether equest declaratory

order, consistent with the legal analysis and conclusions reached in the petition, as soon as

possible to a store move critical uncertainty in this proceeding.
