Nancy:

First of all, thank you for all the work you have done, not just over the past year, but specifically the work of the past five days. Eventually, I will figure out new language to express my gratitude to you, but until then, my sincerest appreciation will just have to suffice.

As I agreed to today, here is the request for Leon Panetta, as well as a piece of information for both of you regarding conflicting information we just received concerning off-sets and the CARE Act for next year.

- Basic need for Title I for FY 1995 (minimum amount of money for the Title that will result in no current Title I city being hurt from a significantly reduced appropriation from this year):
 \$60 million
- Ideal request for Title I for FY 1995 (including 10 15 new cities, unmet need, cost of inflation and increase in caseload):
 \$142 million
- 3. Basic minimum need for the CARE Act for FY 1995 (only looking at minimum need for Title I, unmet Title II from 1994 Presidential original request etc.):

\$120 million MINIMUM

a. Title I: \$60 million

b. Title II: \$50 million

c. Titles IIIb and IV: \$10 million.

Secondly, there is news that either OMB will or will not use some CARE money next year in an off-set for the Health Care Reform budget and finance package.

In an effort to fund health care reform, OMB is looking for EXISTING program off-sets. It is our understanding that, last week, OMB was assuming an offset from Ryan White in the amount of \$150 million dollars.

This offset is related to, but independent of, HHS' FY 1995 budget request being sent through OMB.

Apparently, Gebbie's office was involved in conversations with Leon's office a week or two ago regarding this very issue, and they were apparently assured that OMB was NOT looking for an offset from CARE. However, this afternoon, differing information was received that, in fact, OMB IS looking for an offset from Ryan White.

It would be tremendous if you could get some clarification from Leon as to whether the health care reform package assumes a specific offset from and for Ryan White in FY 1995.

Clearly, in light of the needs of the cities and States, we are not in any position to accept any offsets. CARE needs MORE money next year, not less. Secondly, the health care reform package will not even be implemented fully in 1995. Not only is it premature to act now (with an offset), an actual offset may never be appropriate.

I appreciate your attention in all of this Nancy and I'll speak with you tomorrow.

On behalf of **Mobilization Against AIDS**, I wanted to write to express our deep concern regarding two specific issues confronting the HIV/AIDS communities right now. The first issue is the Administration's "Performance Partnership Grant" proposals, the second being the "single appropriation" proposal contained within the Senate version of the Ryan White CARE Act Reauhorization.

Dr. Steve Morin and I have been in constant communication regarding both these issues, and to a positive result. I have no qualms regarding you and your office's ability to respond appropriately regarding these two issues, but felt that it was about time that I actually wrote the office expressing my concerns (I guess I am experiencing typing withdrawal).

H.R. 1538, the "HIV Prevention Reform Act of 1993" is our blueprint for all of the HIV prevention reform activities across the United States. Your bill establishes HIV prevention community planning (now in its second year), authorizes increases for HIV prevention (which you have single-handedly secured for two years running) and mandates a comprehensive federal planning process for the Public Health Service (which will convene its second phase of activities in June 1995). Out of deference to the Clinton Administration, H.R. 1538 has been administratively orchestrated. We agreed to have this process supersede actual legislation in a goodwill gesture to HHS and PHS to bring about HIV prevention reform administratively rather than risk HIV prevention legislation in the 103rd Congress.

I am tremendously concerned that the proposed "Performance Partnership Grants" (actually block grants under a different moniker) are not only ill-conceived, they ignore the work accomplished over the past two years because of H.R. 1538. As far as I am concerned, we have prevention legislation (H.R. 1538) and are not in need of another legislative proposal, especially given the success of our bill as administered by PHS and the CDC. The Administration's proposal not only directly hurts San Francisco (by eliminating our Cooperative Agreement City status), it hurts our ability to move forward in the meaningful reform activities already in place.

Mobilization Against AIDS is in direct opposition to any legislation this year, in this Congress, that would try to change the direction or deter the reform in place as a result of the impact of H.R. 1538.

I personally hope that you will make sure that the Administration's proposal goes no further than it already has. To this end, a phone call to Leon Panetta could be very useful expressing concern over the political concerns of vetting HIV prevention legislation now, especially given the fact that we already have viable reform in place, predicated on extant legislation (which we have agreed not to push at this time).

Regarding the second issue, that of "single appropriation" language for Titles I and II of the CARE Act, I know Steve has been in communication with the authorizing committee members expressing concern over authorizing language that binds the hands of appropriators. On behalf of my agency, I want you to know how much we appreciate yours and Steve's advocacy to protect the care services for San Franciscans living with HIV/AIDS.

I am worried that the Senate proposal to create a "single appropriation" for Titles I and II will have a devastating impact on San Francisco. If an appropriator was to choose to target dollars into Title I to help increase services (or protect services) they would only net sixty-four percent of every dollar thusly targeted. The math tells me that one would have to appropriate an inordinate amount of money into the single appropriation line item before any appreciable impact on either Title I or II.

Your ability to inform the authorizing committee of your displeasure over this item will be very important in stooping this ill-conceived proposal.

Lastly, Nancy, I just wanted to again thank you for everything. Last week, while on the Hill, I came to a new appreciation of your work (and that of your staff). San Francisco is not just lucky to have you, it owes a lot of its survival to your passion, your political acumen and your dedication. Just know that you have a fan.

Dear Representative Pelosi:
On behalf of, I am writing you to ask for your help in the upcoming Joint Conference between the House of Representatives and the Senate for the FY 1995 Labor, Health and Human Services - Education appropriations bill.
San Francisco is poised to lose critical resources if the funding level for Title I of the CARE Act is not increased. We are disappointed that the Senate mark for Title I of the CARE Act, while \$4 million dollars above the House mark, still leaves us a full \$5 million dollars below the President's FY 1995 Budget request. Under your leadership, we are writing to request that you move your House colleagues to recede to the Senate appropriation for Title I, as well as seek an additional \$5 million dollars for Title I above the Senate appropriation level.
We also are requesting that as you advocate for the House to recede to the Senate appropriations for the remaining titles of the CARE Act, you seek an additional \$5 million dollars for Title IIIb.
San Francisco was awestruck at the increase (\$62.7 million new dollars) you directed for HIV prevention from the House appropriation. Needless to say, we am profoundly disappointed with the minimal increase from the Senate (\$15 million new dollars). We want to support you as you move the Joint Conferees to appropriate the highest amount available for HIV prevention for FY 1995, specifically hoping that the Senate will recede to the House mark of \$62.7 million new dollars.
You have been a leader for San Francisco in the past, Representative Pelosi, and we need you to once again carry our needs for better funding for HIV/AIDS care and prevention.

Dear Representative Pelosi:

With approximately 1 in 200 Californians living with HIV, and close to 80,000 AIDS cases reported in the state to date, the HIV/AIDS crisis has hit no state harder than California. All of America is now realizing the full impact of the HIV/AIDS epidemic as AIDS just recently became the number one killer of people between the ages of 25 and 44 in this nation.

As the HIV/AIDS crisis grows, we encourage you to do all that you can do to ensure the availability of desperately needed federal funding for HIV/AIDS-related care, housing, research and prevention. Despite the budgetary concerns existing at this time, there is ample factual proof and tremendous public support for increased federal HIV/AIDS funding. The recently released, national public opinion poll on AIDS funding, enclosed for your convenience, speaks to this last point very well. If the federal government fails to meet this growing need, it will only transfer the costs to states and localities, which are unable to shoulder all of the burden of the epidemic. Given the large amount of federal AIDS dollars flowing to California, our state's counties and cities would be especially hard hit by funding shortfalls.

The San Francisco AIDS Foundation encourages you to support the funding levels for HIV/AIDS programs stated below. These FY96 funding levels are endorsed by thousands of constituents, including individuals living with HIV/AIDS, community-based service agencies and advocacy coalitions across the nation:

Ryan White CARE Act

Congress should provide a \$300.9 million increase over FY 1996 levels for all titles of the Act for HIV/AIDS care and services. The demand for HIV-related services is skyrocketing with the increase in HIV and AIDS cases. Title I of the Act, which provides emergency assistance to eligible metropolitan areas hardest hit by the epidemic, will expand to cover as many as 17 new Eligible Metropolitan Areas in FY 1996. All of the titles of the CARE Act require increases to deal with medical inflation and increased caseloads. Proposed cuts in a myriad of health and human services programs, including Medicaid, will only place an additional strain on this critical program, which has played a pivotal role in ensuring persons with HIV/AIDS receive appropriate, cost-effective services and care.

Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS (HOPWA)

Congress should provide a \$64 million increase over FY 1996 levels for provision of housing for people with HIV/AIDS who are homeless or at risk for homelessness.

HOPWA is the only federal program that specifically enables cities and states hardest hit by HIV/AIDS to provide community-based, community-controlled, cost-effective housing for people living with the disease and their families. There are obviously a variety of reasons why adequate, affordable housing is essential for people with HIV/AIDS. Quality health care depends on a stable, permanent housing situation. Other social services are difficult to access without such housing as well. Housing also provides the foundation for proper nutrition, hygiene and other elements necessary to quality of life and good health. Thus, the relationship between stable, adequate housing and overall quality, independence and length of life for people battling the disease is obvious. Also, with 10-12 new jurisdictions becoming eligible for HOPWA monies in FY 1996, a \$64 million increase is necessary simply to continue to meet the same level of need the HOPWA program now meets.

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention HIV Prevention Activities

Congress should provide a \$133 million increase over FY 1996 levels for HIV prevention activities to stem the spread of HIV/AIDS.

Prevention is the only "cure" we have for AIDS at this time. Every new HIV infection is a call for greater prevention efforts. The newly-initiated community planning process in the HIV prevention arena is now off the ground. This process enlists local and state health departments and members of affected communities in developing coordinated prevention programming to meet local conditions and needs. This process promises many successes in the fight to stem the reach of the epidemic and maximize the efficient use of federal HIV prevention monies. Significant increases in federal funding are necessary in the prevention area to fund service needs newly identified through the community planning process and to keep pace with an epidemic that has outstripped federal prevention funding levels for many years now.

National Institutes for Health (NIH) HIV-Related Research

Congress should provide a \$356.1 million increase over FY 1996 levels for NIH research to enhance HIV/AIDS treatments and search for a cure for the disease.

Although we have not arrived at a cure for HIV infection or AIDS, NIH-sponsored research has allowed us to make great strides in understanding HIV/AIDS and developing

groundbreaking treatments. We must do better, however, if we are to stem the tide of lost lives and lost years of productivity. The 1993 Congressionally-mandated Office of AIDS Research (OAR) reforms have enhanced the coordination and effectiveness of HIV/AIDS research at NIH. More funds are needed to enable the OAR Director to meet the mandate of a consolidated, aggressive AIDS research plan. NIH scientists have arrived at the \$356.1 million figure as their "professional judgment" budget which indicates the increase needed to fund all significant AIDS research leads.

The HIV/AIDS epidemic demands a comprehensive and adequately funded federal response. We hope and trust that in your role in Congress, you and your staff will support a vigorous federal response to this escalating public health emergency. No Congressional district or county in California is untouched by HIV/AIDS, and district and county borders are no barrier to this virus.

The San Francisco AIDS Foundation is a community-based, non-profit AIDS service organization. We have been Northern California's largest AIDS service provider and leading voice in HIV/AIDS public policy issues since 1982. The San Francisco AIDS Foundation Public Policy Department staff work with individuals and HIV/AIDS service organizations in every Congressional district in Northern California. We hope you will avail yourself of our expertise as critical HIV/AIDS-related issues arise in the budget, appropriations and legislative arenas.
