Selecting and Preparing Peaches

- □ Look for bright, fresh looking peaches. The skin should be creamy or yellow with varying amounts of red blushing.
- Avoid shriveled peaches or green coloring which means they are either over- or under-ripe.
- Store unripe peaches on the counter at room temperature rather than in the refrigerator or in plastic bags.
- Peaches are delicious fresh or cooked. Sliced peaches can be frozen to use later. Add lemon juice to keep cut peaches from browning.
- Add fresh peach slices to your yogurt, oatmeal, cereal or to a scoop of ice cream. Use frozen peaches in baked goods, sauces, or smoothies.
- For a simple smoothie, combine a banana, 2 peaches, ½ cup of canned pears, and 1 cup of low- or non-fat milk in a blender.

Baked Chicken with Peaches Makes 2 servings

2 skinless, boneless chicken breasts 2 tablespoons brown sugar 1 fresh peach, peeled, pitted and sliced Pinch of ground ginger Pinch of ground cloves ½ tablespoon lemon juice 1 teaspoon cornstarch ¼ cup cold water

- 1 Pre-heat oven to 350° F.
- 2 Place chicken in a lightly greased baking dish and sprinkle with half of the brown sugar.
- 3 Place peach slices over chicken, then sprinkle with remaining brown sugar, ginger, cloves and lemon juice.
- 4 Place chicken in oven and bake for 30 minutes, or until chicken is cooked through.
- 5 Dissolve cornstarch into cold water. Pour into cooking juices and stir well. When thickened, spoon over chicken.

Peach Melba

1 ripe peach, peeled and halved ½ cup water 2 tablespoons honey 1 cup fresh or frozen raspberries 1 to 2 teaspoons cornstarch Vanilla frozen yogurt or low-fat ice cream

Makes 2 servings

- 1 In a medium sauce pan combine peaches, water and honey.
- 2 Cook over MEDIUM heat until the peaches are soft, about 5 minutes. Remove peaches with a slotted spoon and set aside to cool.
- 3 In a clean saucepan, combine raspberries and cornstarch, stirring until the cornstarch is dissolved. Cook over MEDIUM heat until mixture thickens, about 3 minutes. Remove from heat and let cool for 10 minutes.
- 4 To serve, top a peach half with a scoop of frozen yogurt or ice cream and a spoonful of warm raspberry sauce.

Just Peachy! Yams

2 sweet potatoes or yams

116-ounce can sliced peaches, drained (keep 2 tablespoons of juice)

¼ cup chopped nuts

Makes 4-6 servings

- 1 Pre-heat oven to 350° F.
- 2 Microwave yams in a shallow dish for 3 to 4 minutes, until they can be pierced with a fork. Cool slightly, then peel and slice into quarters.
- 3 Place yam pieces in a single layer in a baking dish. Layer peach slices. Drizzle with reserved peach juice. Sprinkle with chopped nuts.
- 4 Bake for 15 to 20 minutes until warmed through.
