

Hungry and Thirsty

John 6:35 (NIV)

[35] Then Jesus declared, “I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.”

Bread - pictures Jesus physical body and his words that came through that body.

Blood - pictures the Covenant and everything made available to us through the Covenant.

Matthew 4:2-4 (NIV)

[2] After fasting forty days and forty nights,
he was hungry. [3] The tempter came to him
and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these
stones to become bread." [4] Jesus answered,
"It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone,
but on every word that comes from the mouth
of God.'"

James 2:26 (NIV)

[26] As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.

Genesis 1:1-3 (NIV)

[1] In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. [2] Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. [3] And God said, “Let there be light,” and there was light.

John 6:35 (NIV)

[53] Jesus said to them, “I tell you the truth, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. [54] Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. [55] For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. [56] Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him.
