Forestland Safety & Security Workshop

Learn what you must know to keep yourself and your land safe from uninvited and malicious trespassers. In this online workshop, we will examine common circumstances ranging from the "slightly-annoying" to the fatally-serious. Topics covered include:

- characteristics of criminals and how to react
- trespass, graffiti, vandalism, target shooting
- dumping (of garbage like tires, furniture, appliances) and hazardous waste (toxic chemicals)
- verbal threats, abuse, and harassment; impacts to victims
- thefts, including timber thefts (logs; figured wood bolts) and poaching of both wildlife and plants (mushrooms, greenery, moss, medicinals)
- dope labs and grows, often booby-trapped with guns or other devices to prevent access, or offenders that are heavily armed
- violent crimes like arson, homicide, and other most serious hazardous situations
