Elizabeth Delia Dixon-Carroll

Dr. Elizabeth Delia Dixon-Carroll (1872-1934) served as college physician and taught several courses at Meredith for 35 years. She started her position when the school opened in 1899. While at Meredith, Carroll formed a close bond with many of the students and faculty and became a highly respected member of the Meredith community. Not only was Dr. Dixon-Carroll important to the Meredith community, but she also had a great influence on the Raleigh area. Carroll was the first female medical practitioner in Raleigh. She also was a member of several organizations in the community and advocated for the reformation of delinquent youth care.
