We're taught to "use logic."

People say "Whatever you do DON'T make decisions on emotion."

But it's a load of bollocks. We are emotional creatures. No one operates on pure logic. It's impossible.

Here's the cool part...once you learn to access your emotions more effectively you can actually make more logical decisions because you're AWARE of your emotions. You aren't shutting them out and merely pretending you're using logic.

And at the end of the day the single best way to grow a business is almost always through connections.

It may be a connection to another business. A friend who knows the right person. Or connecting with your prospect in a emotional way that causes them to buy your product.

No matter what your goals are I'd argue you'll get there faster if you can fully access your emotions.
