Cordyline is native to regions of the western Pacific Ocean, from New Zealand and eastern Australia, to southeastern Asia and Polynesia. More commonly known as Dracaena, and sometimes called Palm Lilly or Cabbage Palm, this palm-like, subtropical evergreen tree is characterized by long, sword-like leaves, often in showy colors. Depending on the cultivar, Cordyline will produce panicles of highly fragrant, white to pale lavender flowers, that rise above the foliage. Though commonly grown as an ornamental plant in beds and containers, if left to fully mature, some cultivars can reach heights of 10 to 20 feet. Easily grown Cordyline prefers full to partial sun (more sun equals more vibrant color), and moderate water.

Cordyline 'TORBAY DAZZLER' Bright green with cream margins and pinkish highlights at the leaf base.

Cordyline 'RED STAR' Reddish burgundy, sword-like leaves. Panicles of fragrant white flowers.

Cordyline 'CAN CAN' Pink on red new growth, maturing to cream on green.

Cordyline 'RENEGADE' Striking purple-black, broad foliage with a lacquer-like sheen. Compact, tightly clumping habit. Panicles of white, star shaped flowers.

Cordyline 'DESIGN-A-LINE BURGUNDY' Fine textured, weeping, burgundy foliage. Tightly clumping habit. Delicate spikes of pale lavender flowers.

Cordyline 'SALSA' Weeping, red on pink foliage deepens in color with age.

Cordyline 'SUNDANCE' Deep green leaves have a pink center stripe and pink highlights at the base.
