Pieris japonica 'Flaming Silver'

In early spring, fragrant, bell shaped flowers, ranging in color from pure white to rosy magenta, are borne on cascading racemes up to six inches long. Depending on the cultivar, showy new growth, in brilliant hues of lime green, bronze, pink or scarlet, comes on the heels of Pieris' long-lasting blossoms. Pieris is a member of the same family as rhododendrons and azaleas, and thrives in the same moist, but well drained, acidic soil. Versatile Pieris displays equally well in mass plantings, in borders or beds, as a specimen, or in a container.

- USDA Zones 4 to 9 (varies)
- Size at ten years varies by cultivar; yak types remain more compact
- Full sun to partial shade; well-drained acidic soil; average water
- Evergreen foliage; some cultivars variegated; showy new growth
- Bell-shaped flowers in shades of white, pink or red
- Drought tolerant
