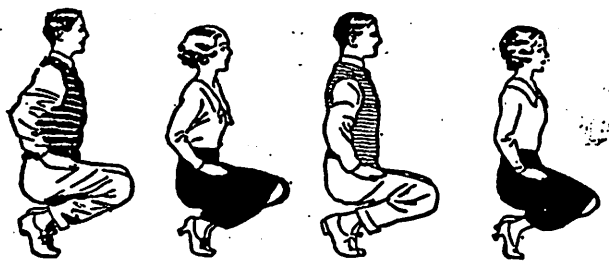

Hash Ride #25 on Sunday, May 22, 1994
Hares: MERCURY and CRISIS CURTIS.
Co-Hares: ROCKET and QUICKSILVER ENDERLE

*Yep it's true, BHHB may

The hares gathered in front of ISB at 13:30 anxiously anticipating the start of ride #25. Hare Mercury was a bit nervous setting her first hash--first when it looked as though no one would arrive (never fear--36 paid participants trickled in before 15:00) and then again when she realized that the industrious servicemen at ISB possessed a small street sweeper with which they tidied up a good bit of the ride. Luckily there were four hares on hand. Rocket Joel took off with the riders to make sure they could find their way, Quicksilver Chris rode ahead to check the ISB gate which was needed after the first leg of the ride and was found mysteriously locked at 14:00, Mercury Susan tore off with flour and paper in hand to re-set the parts of the ride that the sweepers had erased, and Crisis Chris camped out at the down-down site to keep an eye on the food and beer.

The ride began with a slightly frustrating backpack around a walled subdivision. After riding around aimlessly looking for the trail, Rocket took mercy on the riders and led them back the way they had come and out the gate. Because of an early rain, cars parked over crucial arrows, and the general fastidiousness of the residents along the hash who insisted on cleaning up paper behind the hares, Rocket rode along to keep the riders heading in the right direction. The trail looped around outside Nichida Park and then made its way to the back side of ISB and through the newly-opened gate that Quicksilver guarded. The hares had promised a very short, flat ride, and many of the riders believed they were finished. They were assured they were mistaken as they followed the trail around the ISB lake and out of Nichida Park.

Because the hares were afraid the riders would not figure out the next long and exceedingly more frustrating backpack, an obvious check was laid at the intersection at the last moment. The riders quickly found the trail and cut off what had been one of the most scenic parts of the ride. The trail then wandered on and off a busy, dusty road, veered off through a garbage dump and headed past a golf course. It was at this point that the trail doubled back on itself. Mercury raced to the area to keep riders on the left, but she was not fast enough. Four riders had beaten her there, taken the trail to the right and headed on in--skipping about 30 minutes of the ride. Mercury apologized for the mix up and showed them how to catch the pack (the riders later admitted that they were tired and waited for the pack to catch up with THEM over a cold drink). The rest of the pack managed to stay together as the trail meandered around a number of bumpy, muddy roads. They eventually made it back after an hour and half ride which covered around 23 kilometers.

A thicket of BHHB members braved the 470km journey to Sukothai to join the Country Roads circuit 35 and 40 km Mountain Bike races on Saturday afternoon and the 21.1kms half marathon and 5km runs on Sunday morning.

The mountain bike race on Saturday was right up there at National championship standards with river, mud and climbing hazards etc. but, they did not deter our brave and gutsy members from completing a very demanding, well marshalled and well thought out course.

First home on the under 19's course was Oscar "Mudmagnet" Battram who rode the 35kms in 95 minutes averaging BHHB's fastest speed of the day at almost 23 kms/hour. Even Gordon "Ghost" Robinson who was first home for BHHB on the seniors 40km course in 94 minutes could not match that. In hot pursuit was Peter "Wheel-Wobble" Battram who cruised in after 113 minutes, having enjoyed the race immensely, to find his legs had turned to jelly! Jeff "Blow-out" Kemp and Nigel "Slimy" Pike led the peloton ON-IN....soon after...in 118 and 119 minutes respectively despite Blow-out crashing several times and Slimy wearing a race approved pink striped turban? Bruce "Lily" Miller and Lem "Gander" Morgan rode round together in just over two hours with Lily's borrowed bike saddle coming loose and Gander trashing his Chinese speedo then losing his water bottle, front wheel and front tooth. Nipat "Nuts" Piyanirothai and Sarabjit "Rintin-tin" Sachdev sandwiched her holyness the GS Tricia "Goose" Morgan over the finishing line and rolled in a little later. Goose was 5th in her age group and won a huge trophy presented to her by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the second of Englands representative in Sukothai, her hubby, Gander.

On Sunday morning Mudmagnet and Hannah "Bannah" Battram ran the 5km race with Mudmagnet finishing as anticipated in 23 minutes and Bannah in her first ever 5km race in a creditable 35 minutes. Karis "U-Bend" Battram won a massive trophy for finishing second in her age group in the half marathon in 2 hours 0 minutes and 46 seconds eclipsing the courageous Andy "Swollen Member" Welsh who ran home in 1 hour 34 minutes, and close to his personal best, after a heavy session of beer and cigs the night before.

Congratulations to all BHHB members and ON-ON to Mae Sot on June 25.

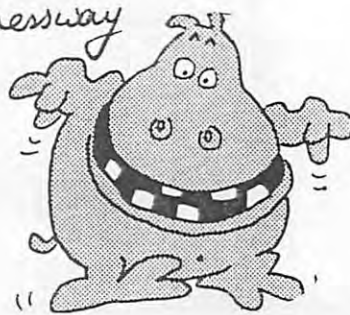

or U-turn on Chaengwattana and ZERO your odometer under
the 2nd stage expressway. Turn left after 200m into
Muang Thong Thani @ the Bouygues/Thai sign. At 1.5km
go straight at the roundabout until the "T" junction with

Washing-machine man Obree cleans up again

WASHING-MACHINE man Graeme Obree regained the world one-hour record from big rival Chris Boardman here on Wednesday in sensational style.

The eccentric Scot, riding a home-made bike which includes parts from a washing machine, stormed to a new mark of 52.713kms to beat Olympic pursuit champion Boardman's 52.270km.

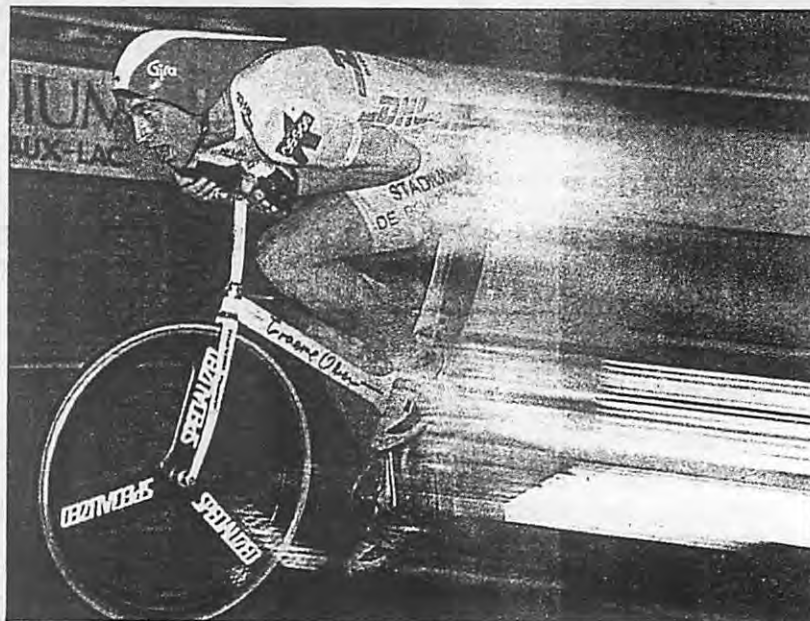
That performance, though just outside his target of 53km, is sure to induce others — number one professional rider Miguel Indurain in particular — to try and go even further.

Obree had vowed to get the record back after beating Italian Francesco Moser's 1984 mark last July in Norway, only to lose it a week later to Englishman Boardman.

And he had reason to be confident that he could go better. His last world best mark was set in astonishing fashion on his own bike, just 24 hours after he had failed on another machine.

Obree, who rides in a unique crouched style leaning on the steering bars, was on target early on after a typically slow start caused by his high gearing.

With 20 minutes to go a new record looked certain, as the Scot carved a 20 second lead over Boardman's split time and that grew to 26secs with a quarter of an hour to go and 29secs with ten minutes left.

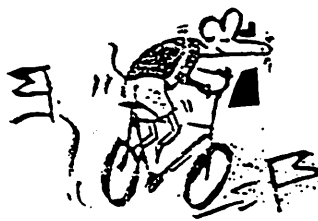

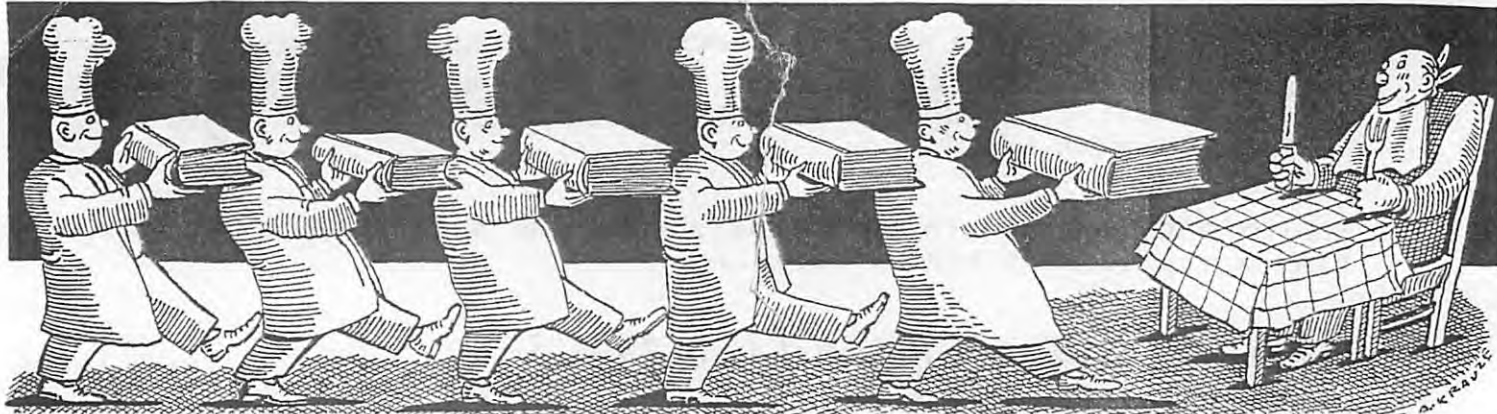

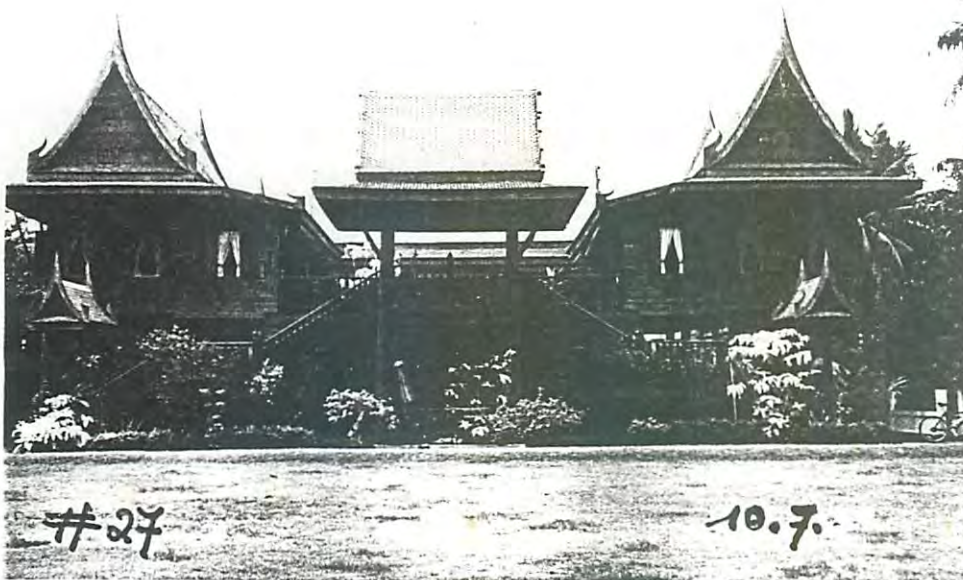

Continue west on Rattanaibet Road for 9 km to the T-junction with Route 340 (Suphanburi Road). Turn left on Route 340. Proceed south about 4 km to the Bang Yai intersection. Turn right (HHH sign) on road to Bang Kulat (and Wat PraNgern). Proceed 1 km and turn right (HHH sign) into "Thai House". Park. On-On-On at the site.



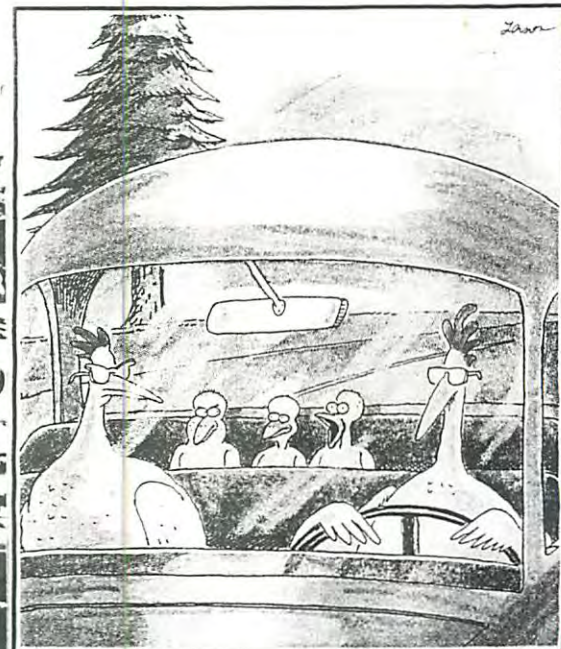
