$4+4/2 = 6$

 $90\text{km in miles} = 55.9234 \text{ miles}$   
 $\sin(90 \text{ deg}) + \tan(45 \text{ deg}) = 2$   
 $\text{sqrt}(4)+3^3 = 29$   
 $\text{pi} = 3.14159$
