The Simple 3-Step Process for Family Caregivers to Care Without Chaos and Guilt

The Simple 3 Step Process Instructions (see next page for your personal Time Bank Planner)

Step 1 – Your Time Bank – this is where you will calculate how many extra hours you have each week. In the example below, I have included only basic family activities. This doesn't include anything you would do for self care, for fun, or extras such as haircuts, concerts, watching the children's activities, volunteer time, clothes shopping, unexpected trips to the doctor, paying bills, car or house maintenance, etc, etc.

First column: Make a list of activities you regularly do each day and/or week. Include everything you can think of, including reading, TV, driving children/spouse, visiting friends, family, car/house/yard maintenance.

Second column: Write down the # of hours per day (that you do the activity) x (times) the # of days a week you do the activity. Put the answer in the third column.

Third Column: The total of your calculation in the second column is your "Total Weekly Hours" for each activity.

Fourth Column: Subtract the total weekly hours (3rd Column) from the number in the Time Bank Balance (4th column) in the line above. For example, in the first line below, the total weekly hours for sleeping is 56. The Time bank balance in line above is 168. 168-56=112 hours left in the time bank.

Step 2: Choose 3 activities that you really don't like doing. You might not like them because of the time it takes, it's inconvenient, or you just really don't like doing it.

Step 3: List 3 people you will ask for help with the activities you've listed in Step 2. You have friends and family who want to help. Give them the gift of feeling they've made a difference.
