Follow the building code.

• Be sure to follow the building code requirements applicable in your region.



Install sheathing membrane.

 Sheathing membrane to be installed as per local building code requirements.



Plan the joints.

 Apply the insulating sheathing board over the exterior of wood framing with all vertical edges of boards butted tightly together over stud locations for adequate support.



Install exterior cladding.

• Follow cladding manufacturer instructions and building code requirements for installation of exterior finishing materials.



Use correct fasteners.

Insulation board must be fastened to framing using fasteners with heads or washers at least 1/2" diameter where the cladding will be applied directly against the insulation. Fasteners with heads or washers at least 1" diameter must be used where an air space will exist between the insulation board and the cladding (e.g. brick cladding).

Notes to Table:

- 1. Minimum thickness applies for insulating sheathing when exterior walls and gable ends must be sheathed when the exterior cladding requires intermediate fastening between supports or if the exterior cladding requires solid backing.
- 2. Where wood shingles or shakes are applied over insulating sheathing, the shingles or shakes must be attached to a wood lath not less than 38 mm by 9.5 mm thick securely nailed to the framing.
- 3. Minimum thickness of continuous insulating sheathing applied to the exterior of wood frame walls must also comply with regional requirements for ratio of outboard to inboard thermal resistance (see Plasti-Fab PIB 287 for additional guidance.

Follow the building code.

 Be sure to follow the building code requirements applicable in your region.

The wall surfaces must be clean, dry and free of foreign materials and sharp projections.



Start From a Corner.

• Starting from a corner, attach insulation boards to the basement wall using an adhesive compatible with expanded polystyrene (EPS) insulation.



Frame the Wall.

 Construct a wood framed wall to be installed in front of the insulated basement wall to support the 1/2" thick avpsum board. The vertical framing members should be at least 2'x2' spaced at 16" or 24" on centres.



Install the Wall.

 Fasten the framed wall to the upper floor ioist and basement floor leaving a small gap between the insulation and the back of the framed wall. Electrical wiring can be placed by running it in the small gap behind the framing. Use shallow electrical boxes.



Measure and Cut.

Measure and cut insulation board with a utility knife or fine tooth hand saw such as a keyhole type or drywall saw to fit openings such as windows. Insulation boards should be tightly butted together.



Attach Gypsum.

• See Vapour Barrier note & reference Plasti-Fab Product Information Bulletin 284 for additional information.

Attach 1/2" thick gypsum board to the face of the framed wall.



PlastiSpan insulation at minimum 5" thickness used as the sole thermal insulation does not require a separate vapour barrier to control condensation within the assembly.

Canadian code recognizes that when low-permeance insulation is the sole thermal insulation in a building assembly the temperature of the inner surface of the low-permeance insulation will be close to the interior room temperature.

Prepare to Lay Sub-Floor

 Mark the walls where the nailer centres intersect it to help locate the nailers when attaching the sub-floor. The sub-floor thickness should be 5/8" T&G. Snap chalk lines across the nailers to ensure the sub floor material is placed squarely.



Install a Moisture Barrier

Cover the entire floor area with a 6-mil polyethylene moisture barrier to eliminate moisture migration into your living area. Plan your project to place your insulation and nailers at 24" on centre across the floor in one direction.



Secure the Sub-Floor

• Be sure to stagger the floor sheathing joints for extra stability. Apply adhesive to the nailers. Fasten the 5/8" floor sheathing directly to the nailers using either ringed nails or deck screws every 8". With an air nailer, use 2-inch ringed floor sheathing or screw nails. With a screw gun, use 1-1/2" or 1-3/4" deck



Attach Perimeter Nailers

Attach nailer with the same thickness as the insulation around the perimeter using self-tapping concrete screws penetrating the concrete floor as recommended by the screw manufacturer.



Ready for Floor Finishing.

 Your basement floor is now correctly insulated and ready for your final decorating touch. You should notice the finished floor is now much more comfortable.



**Install Nailers and Insulation** 

Cut the first row of insulation to a 21-3/4" width. Cut subsequent rows to 22-1/2" widths. Use the insulation cut as guides to place successive rows of nailers at 24" on centres.

#### **Energy Tip**

On traditional cathedral ceilings where tongue and groove timber exposed on the inside is used as an architectural feature, PlastiSpan insulation board is ideal for both single and double layered applications.

Fastening Layers of Insulation.

 Fasten second layer nailer to first layer nailer where they intersect. If the thermal resistance requires extra layers of insulation, add layers to the bottom of the system changing the nailer direction as required. The top nailer must always run from the bottom of the roof slope to the ridge of roof.



First Layer of Insulation.

 Use nailers the same thickness as the first layer of insulation. Lay nailer, then insulation, then nailer up the slope of the roof, all joints tightly butted. Fasten nailer to deck as work proceeds.



Finish.

5 Finish.
Nail roof sheathing to nailers taking care that air movement is unobstructed in ventilation space.



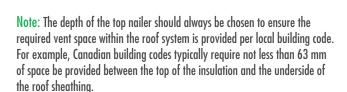
Second Layer of Insulation.

 Lay second layer of insulation perpendicular to first layer. Lay insulation with joints tightly butted. Lay nailers over insulation spaced to support roof sheathing. Second layer of nailers to achieve a minimum airspace as determined by local building code.



**Roofing Cover.** 

 Install roof covering in accordance with manufacturer's instructions. Adequate ventilation must be insured using an acceptable method to the applicable building code and/or local regulations.
