SECTION 4 First-aid measures

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Description of first aid measures

Eye Contact	If this product comes in contact with the eyes: Immediately hold eyelids apart and flush the eye continuously with running water for at leat 15 minutes.Removal of contact lenses after an eye injury should only be undertaken by skilled personnel.
Skin Contact	If skin or hair contact occurs: Immediately flush body and clothes with large amounts of water, using safety shower if available. Quickly remove all contaminated clothing, including footwear. Wash skin and hair with running water.

SECTION 11 Toxicological information

Information	on	toxicological effects	

The material can cause respiratory irritation in some persons. The body's response to such irritation can cause further lung damage. Corrosive acids can cause irritation of the respiratory tract, with coughing, choking and mucous membrane damage. There may be dizziness, headache, nausea and weakness.

The material has **NOT** been classified by EC Directives or other classification systems as 'harmful by inhalation'. This is because of the lack of corroborating animal or human evidence.

Inhalation of aerosols (mists, fumes), generated by the material during the course of normal handling, may be harmful.

Ingestion

Ingestion of acidic corrosives may produce burns around and in the mouth, the throat and oesophagus. Immediate pain and difficulties in swallowing and speaking may also be evident.

The material has NOT been classified by EC Directives or other classification systems as 'harmful by ingestion'. This is because of the lack of corroborating animal or human evidence.

Accidental ingestion of the material may be harmful; animal experiments indicate that ingestion of less than 150 gram may be fatal or may produce serious damage to the health of the individual.

Skin Contact

Skin contact with acidic corrosives may result in pain and burns; these may be deep with distinct edges and may heal slowly with the formation of scar tissue.

Skin contact is not thought to have harmful health effects (as classified under EC Directives); the material may still produce health damage following entry through wounds, lesions or abrasions.

Acrylic acid is a definite skin sensitiser and can cause features of allergic skin reactions.

Open cuts, abraded or irritated skin should not be exposed to this material

This material can cause inflammation of the skin on contact in some persons.

Eye

This material can cause eye irritation and damage in some persons.

Isopropanol vapour may cause mild eye irritation at 400 parts per million. Splashes may cause severe eye irritation, possible burns to the cornea and eye damage. Eye contact may cause tearing and blurring of vision.

Chronic

Repeated or prolonged exposure to acids may result in the erosion of teeth, swelling and/or ulceration of mouth lining. Irritation of airways to lung, with cough, and inflammation of lung tissue often occurs.

Skin contact with the material is more likely to cause a sensitisation reaction in some persons compared to the general population.

Main 3-(TRIMETHOXYSILYL)PROPYL criteria for diagnosing RADS include the absence of previous airways disease in a non-atopic individual, with sudden onset of persistent **METHACRYLATE & ACRYLIC** asthma-like symptoms within minutes to hours of a documented exposure to the irritant. **ACID & MALEIC ACID &** ISOPROPANOL Windshield Saver Kit & The following information refers to contact allergens as a group and may not be specific to this product. 2-HYDROXYETHYL Contact allergies quickly manifest themselves as contact eczema, more rarely as urticaria or Quincke's oedema. The pathogenesis of contact **METHACRYLATE & MALEIC** eczema involves a cell-mediated (T lymphocytes) immune reaction of the delayed type. Windshield Saver Kit & Low molecular weight alkoxysilane can cause irreversible lung damage when inhaled at low dose. It is not an obvious skin irritant. However, 3-(TRIMETHOXYSILYL)PROPYL studies suggest with repeated occupational exposure, methoxysilane may cause damage to the eye and skin as well as cancer. **METHACRYLATE** Windshield Saver Kit & UV (ultraviolet) / EB (electron beam) acrylates are generally of low toxicity. UV/EB acrylates are divided into two groups the "stenomeric" and ISO-BORNYL ACRYLATE "eurymeric" acrylates. Stenomeric acrylates are usually more hazardous than the eurymeric substances Based on the available oncogenicity data and without a better understanding of the carcinogenic mechanism the Health and Environmental Windshield Saver Kit & Review Division (HERD), Office of Toxic Substances (OTS), of the US EPA previously concluded that all chemicals that contain the acrylate or **ISO-BORNYL ACRYLATE &** methacrylate moiety (CH2=CHCOO or CH2=C(CH3)COO) should be considered to be a carcinogenic hazard unless shown otherwise by 3-(TRIMETHOXYSILYL)PROPYL **METHACRYLATE** This position has now been revised and acrylates and methacrylates are no longer de facto carcinogens. Where no 'official' classification for acrylates and methacrylates exists, there have been cautious attempts to create classifications in the **ISO-BORNYL ACRYLATE &** absence of contrary evidence.
