## Growing Plants with SmartFarm<sup>™</sup> LED Grow Light System

### Lesson 1: Planting Seeds

Students will spend the day putting together components of the Grow Light, and getting acquainted with the materials used for growing plants: Grow Light, seeds, and soil, and learning the vocabulary except control and variable which will be discussed in the second lesson.

### Lesson 2: Controls versus Variables

Students will learn about controls and variables. They will choose a variable to test against the control. They can change the LED light combination, water, soil-type, temperature, number of seeds. Set up the experiment.

### Lesson 3: Watch them Grow

Using the data charts, record the changes you see as your seeds grow. This will take place over a number of weeks. Introduce the lab report and have students complete it as the experiments take place.

### Lesson 3: Communicate the Results

Using the data charts, record the changes you see as your seeds grow. Compare the results to your hypothesis. Reflect on the changes each time you make an observation. Encourage students to take pictures of the plants and place them in an album to see the changes over time. This will take place over a number of weeks. Introduce the lab report and have students complete it as the experiments take place.

### Lesson 1: What is Scientific Inquiry?

Students will be introduced to the SmartFarr™ LED Grow Light System. After watching the video on growing with LED lights, have students list out their questions about growing plants with the LED Grow Light. Encourage discussions on "light recipes" and promote inquiry by having students challenge each other to research possibilities for growing plants under LED lights. They will be planning scientific inquiry investigations using the LED Grow Light in the next lesson.

### Lesson 2: Design an Investigation using Scientific Inquiry

Students will continue to engage with the LED Grow Light and choose a particular question to explore. Students should know that as the investigation plays out, their findings may shift their focus and bring them closer to the evidence-based answer they are seeking. If students are struggling, have them consider changing the LED light combination, water, soil-type, temperature, number of seeds. Set up the initial investigation.

### **Lesson 3: Implementation and Communication**

As the investigation unfolds, encourage constant exploration and research into concepts at play in the investigation. Possible areas to explore include light waves, light emissions, growing seasons, growing patterns, geographic locations, geotechnical studies in the area, alternate ideas about answering the same scientific question, to name a few.

Using the data charts, record the changes as they occur. Compare the results to your hypothesis. Reflect on the changes each time you make an observation and discuss where the knowledge gaps are in the experiment. What does the team need to learn more about? This will take place over a number of weeks. Introduce the lab report and have students complete it as the experiments unfold.

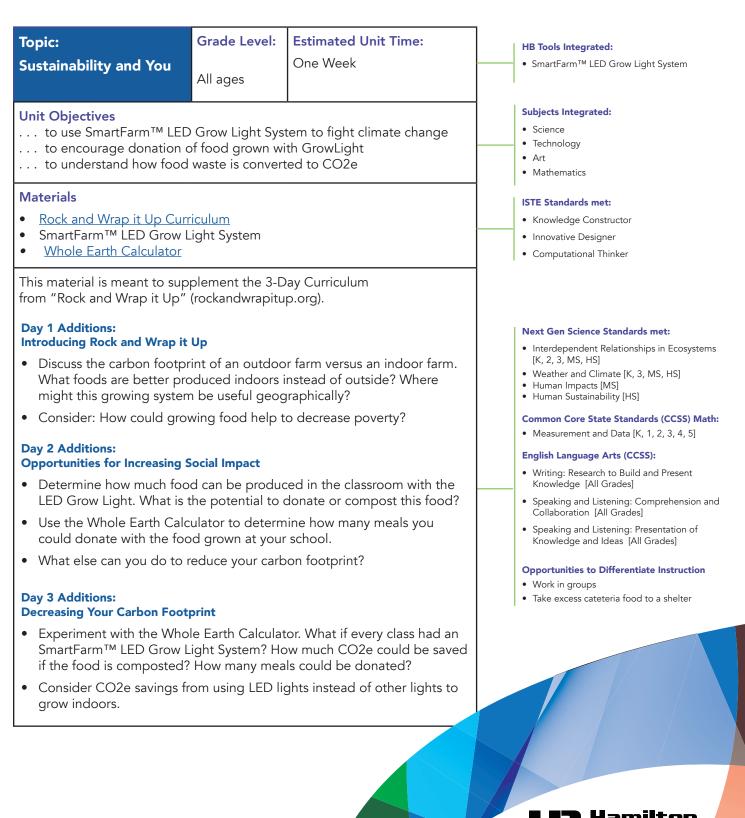

# **Lesson Plan**

Recommended for ages 9 years old and above

## SmartFarm<sup>™</sup> LED Grow Light System

### Objectives

- Develop a smart device that maintains a suitable growth environment for plants using sensors.
- Understand the background and application areas of smart farming technology.
- Verify the input/output process of the materials through physical operations to enhance understanding and interest in software.

#### Summary

This project aims to explore the environmental factors required for plant growth and create a smart farm device that utilizes Arduino and various sensor modules to provide an optimal growth environment.

#### Activity

- 1. Understanding various smart farming technologies applied in agriculture.
- 2. Arduino coding using C language and electronic circuit wiring.
- 3. Writing algorithms that produce different execution values based on various sensor conditions by linking multiple sensors.

#### Requirements

PC, Arduino SmartFarm™ Grow Light System

#### **1st Session**

- Understanding the background and application fields of smart farming
- Learning about various environmental factors necessary for plant growth and designing a personal smart farm.

### 2nd Session

- Installing the Arduino Integrated Development Environment (IDE).
- Understanding Arduino interface and hardware.

#### **3rd Session**

- Assemble the smart farm main body using a wooden frame.
- Connect input/output devices such as soil moisture sensors and temperature/humidity sensors to the circuit.

#### 4th Session

• Research suitable light wavelengths and soil moisture for plant growth to create reference for coding.

#### **5th Session**

- Creating an icon library that displays different icons according to the humidity value.
- Displaying the sensor input value on the LCD.

#### **6th Session**

- Create a conditional statement to adjust the output of the growth LED according to the condition value.
- Debugging the source code of the SmartFarm<sup>™</sup>.
- Discuss additional features that can be added to the SmartFarm™.
