

Code of Conduct - Parent/Spectator

Parents and spectators have the responsibility to:

- Remember that participants play hockey for their own enjoyment.
- Not have unrealistic expectations. Remember that players are not professionals and cannot be judged by professional standards.
- Not ridicule a player for making a mistake during a game. Give positive comments that motivate and encourage continued effort.
- Respect the officials' decisions and encourage participants to do the same. Yelling at officials is never acceptable.
- Condemn the use of violence in any form. Share concerns in an appropriate manner with coaches and league officials.
- Show respect for the teams' opponents, because without them there would be no game.
- Actively encourage athletes to uphold the rules of their sport and the spirit of such rules.
- Respect the coach's decisions and encourage open communications with them.
- Refrain from public criticism of athletes, coaches, officials or other spectators.
- Refrain from the use of profane or insulting language.
- Harassing players, coaches, officials or MMHA volunteers other spectators may result in disciplinary action.
- Ensure players are on time for all practices and games. Give coaches ample warning if a player will miss a practice or game.
