#### **Referee Coordinator – Denise Anderson**

Overall i feel it was a good year for the referees. It was so great to see interest from the younger refs. I had no issues from kids or parents with scheduling. I feel I did a good job in giving each ref equal opportunities. The Goalline system I use to assign works well. But in order for it to work well we need full cooperation from kids/parents. Many did not set their availability, accept assigned games or even check Goalline. This resulted in me having to do many email and text follow ups. The Referee Coordinator position is a very time consuming and demanding role that is done on a daily basis for the whole season. It is a constant pace of assigning, following up via text/email, reassigning, etc. I am very thankful that I had Vanessa Macdonald step up to help out with assigning for the U18 and U15 teams though she encountered the same struggles that I had

this year.

Because of the demand of this role I am sorry to say that I am needing to give it up for the next season. It was very difficult to juggle it with my full time job and my own kids in hockey.

I feel that assigning refs should not be placed back onto each team because this could result in unfair assigning and refs missing out on games. The referee coordinator role is vital in our association and I feel that the one way you will get commitment is by compensating this role. This should of course be applied to just having one person to do the role. Or if compensation is not an option then to continue on with sharing this role.

### **Equipment Report – Tyson Ross**

2022\2023 Clavet Cougars Equipment Report

*May* 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022

We have continued to go through the process of upgrading some of our U18 and U15 Jersey set's. We had received the 2 new white sets for U18 last year and purchased 2 more U15 sets

within this current year's budget. We are seeking to increase the purchasing frequency from 4 sets to 6 sets in this upcoming budget. We plan to continue replacing 2 sets per year until U18, U15 and U13 have been updated.

We are looking at options to purchase slightly higher quality jerseys for better longevity as some of the new ones seem to be showing wear quite a bit.

The U11 Atomic jerseys and socks have been ordered for next year. Enough for 3 teams. Extra socks have been ordered as well.

We have a good level of the Cougars socks however will order more to top up the current inventory. Most likely will be the same price as last year, \$30 per pair.

## **U18A Team Report – Steven Wright**

*This years 'team consisted of mainly of Grade 10 and 11 players. We only had (1) Grade 12 skater – who, unfortunately, between COVID and injuries hardly played.* 

Most nights in league play we were definitely outsized/muscled – we had a couple blowouts, but

Coaches Comments:

I really enjoyed my time coaching the U15B team and believe that we had a great season. I didn't keep perfect records of our wins / losses, but I estimate that we maintained about a 40-45% win ratio across all league, exhibition and tournament games.

Through the course of the year we had a few challenges along the way internally to the team that provided us an opportunity to learn and grow. I am very proud of the team how they pulled together through the year as a team and how their hockey skills improved along the way. We fell a bit short of my team plan for the number of practices and this was unfortunate as there is always lots to learn at practice. I would recommend planning for approximately 8 practices

per month for October thru January and reducing to 4 practices per month in February – March as school break and playoffs start to compress the schedule.

We found it challenging to find U15B tournaments to attend this season but due to this fact we were also very successful at filling our own tournament hosted in Allan. Even the U15A team hosted a U15B tournament as a fund raiser as there was limited availability and hence a great opportunity to raise some funds.

The Moose Jaw tournament was a highlight of the season. The team played really well, the families shared a few laughs and a few pints which was a great opportunity to get to know everyone a bit better. The tournament in Moose Jaw was really well run and I would recommend it to future teams.
