#### 1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Stonewall Minor Hockey and Ringette Association Inc. (the "organization") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated provincially under the Corporations Act of Manitoba. As a registered charity the organization is exempt from the payment of income tax under Section 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.

The organization operates to provide a facility and instruction for ice sports to minors in the area.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of presentation

The financial statements were prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNFPO). Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations are part of Canadian GAAP.

#### Financial instruments policy

Financial instruments consist of cash, term deposits, and payables. Unless otherwise noted, it is management's opinion that the organization is not exposed to significant credit, interest rate, liquidity, or market (other price) risks arising from these financial instruments. Market risks result from changes in interest rates, exchange rates of foreign currencies and market prices of financial instruments.

#### Capital expenditures

Capital assets are recorded as an expenditure when purchased. There is no policy in effect for recording the historical cost of such assets and amortizing the cost over the years of useful life.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash includes cash and cash equivalents. Highly liquid investments with maturities of ninety days or less at date of purchase are classified as cash equivalents.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### Fund accounting

Stonewall Minor Hockey and Ringette Association Inc. follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions.

The Operating Fund accounts for the organization's program delivery and administrative activities. This fund reports unrestricted resources and restricted operating grants.

The Support Fund reports the contributions and expenditures for children that require financial assistance in order to participate in hockey or ringette.

Capital Improvements reports significant capital expenditures and equipment additions.

The Special Projects Fund reports surplus amounts from various past individual tournaments that have been designated for larger projects at some point in the future.

The 40th Anniversary Fund reports profits from past Veteran's Cup committees to be spent for the 40th annual Veteran's Cup tournament in February 2021.

#### Measurement uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Such estimates are periodically reviewed and any adjustments necessary are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### Revenue recognition

The organization recognizes revenues when they are earned, specifically when all the following conditions are met:

- services are provided or products are delivered to customers
- there is clear evidence that an arrangement exists
- amounts are fixed or can be determined
- the ability to collect is reasonably assured.
