

Anti-Doping Policy

- The Ontario Ball Hockey Federation (OBHF) is committed to drug-free, ethical, and fair play in sport, and prohibits the use of Banned Substances and Practices. The OBHF delegates authority and responsibility for carrying out Doping Control Procedures in Canada, for any players participating in the OBHF to the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES). Furthermore, the OBHF will abide by the penalties prescribed by Sport Canada as a minimum standard.
- 2. The Ontario Ball Hockey Federation (OBHF) through membership in Canadian Ball Hockey Association (CBHA) has adopted the 2015 Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) as its primary domestic anti-doping policy. This is administered by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES), the 2015 CADP is fully compliant with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code, International Standards and Guidelines as they may exist from time to time. - 3. In addition, the Canadian Ball Hockey Association (CBHA), as a member federation of the International Street and Ball Hockey Federation (ISBHF) shall also be fully compliant with the ISBHF anti-doping rules and athlete testing. The ISBHF anti-doping rules apply to OBHF athletes competing internationally as part of Team Canada. The ISBHF anti-doping rules are fully compliant with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code, International Standards and Guidelines as they may exist from time to time.
