-Thank you to everyone for being so patient with me during this past year's registration! It was a new position for me, and it was a steep learning curve, but Camille was amazing and gave me tips ahead of time and when needed throughout. Thank you to Camille for letting me pick your brain!

-425 kids registered for the 2021-2022 season

-Registration dates will be June 1-Aug 31. Anyone after that may not get a spot in Renegades zone and will have to pay the late fee as it goes through SMHA, not direct to Renegades

-Things to know about Teamlinkt registration this year

- New system means having to re-input all information- no longer using access codes. Will need to re-submit health card numbers (previously you could click on "previously registered". This means all coaches will have to put in their certificates as well.
- Everyone should have a Teamlinkt account from previous seasons or possibly other sports
- Please be patient with the new system, email me if you have any problems with it. We are trying to have it all set up before hand, but may run into minor problems as we go
- Best part is that it runs on Sask time (Gonline ran on a different time zone) so registration will be open until 1159 on Aug 31 (rather than 10pm)
- Will now have spots on the form where you can let the zone know ahead of time that you are interested in Coaching/Assist Coaching/Manager for your child's team

-With U15A going to a separate zone, anyone wanting to register to try out for U15A will need to go to the SMHA website to sign up there (exactly like you currently must for AA). U13A will still be hybrid and through Renegades registration at this time
