Collective Bargaining – Police Union

Town Manager Maureen Valente reviewed the Tentative Items agreed to with the Sudbury Police Union. She pointed out the two items that the Board of Selectmen (BOS) had not previously agreed to and asked the BOS if they support all items as a Complete and Overall package.

She further stated that tonight's discussions and decisions would be used as a basis for other municipal unions.

Chairman O'Brien moved to endorse the package as negotiated by the Town Manager. Vice Chairman Haarde seconded the motion.
