

Cable Committee  
Minutes – January 11, 2000

Dear Committee members,

On January 11, 2000, the Sudbury Cable Commission met at the high school. Present were Doug Smith, Jeff Winston, Peggy Fredrickson, Bob Kavanaugh, and Marty Greenstein. Absent were Michael Daitzman and Hal Barnett.

Doug Smith presented a proposed submission to the Town for its annual report. It was discussed, revised, and signed by the committee. Doug will submit it. It was reported that Nathan, who had been running our Local Access studio, was transferred to another town, believed to be Littleton. The committee expressed its concern that it was not officially informed and that, by not manning the station, Cablevision was in apparent violation of its contract. Furthermore, Peggy reported that her church had been unable to contact the Local Access station to submit a bulletin board listing. She also reported that for several weeks, the station was not cable casting sound. Doug will call Peter Epstein to arrange a meeting for the 20th at six P.M. Peggy will check to see if the library is free for this meeting. We intend to host David Green of Cablevision at a date following that meeting. The sale of the Sudbury assets of Cablevision, long rumored, is still as imminent as ever. Because of professional duties that have somewhat consistently forced him to travel, Doug presented to the Committee a letter of resignation. The Committee regretfully accepted his resignation and unanimously voted that Jeff Winston replace him. Doug will perform the actions cited above and expressed his hope to be able to continue to attend committee meetings when he is available for them. Bob Kavanaugh is reviewing the list of equipment for the I-net that was provided by Cablevision in its Form 100 submitted to us last month. On behalf of the committee, I wish to thank Doug Smith for outstanding service as chairman since last August when he was elected and before that as secretary. All of us hope that he will find himself able to rejoin us officially at some time in the future. We made a lot of progress under his leadership. As usual please e-mail me any corrections or additions.
