Remote Teleconference Meeting and Public Hearing

To help insure public safety during the Coronavirus outbreak, on March 12, 2020 Governor Baker issued an Executive Order suspending certain provisions of the Open Meeting Law, MGL Chapter 30A, Section 20 (<https://www.mass.gov/doc/open-meeting-law-order-march-12-2020/download>). This Order permits governmental bodies such as the Historical Commission to hold meetings and public hearings remotely/virtually via telephone, internet, audio/video conferencing, or other acceptable technology. Therefore, the March 24, 2020 meeting and public hearing will be convened by a quorum of Historical Commission members calling in to a conference line at **978-639-3310**.
