

# Frost Farm Watershed Inventory

<b>White Pond</b>	
<p>White Pond is a Great Pond shown as within the Frost Farm Watershed. Wholly located within Concord, White Pond is defined as a kettle pond because, having no tributary streams or outlets, the water level increases only through rain. The lack of outlets impairs the pond's ability to rid itself of contamination and harmful pollutants. Although stocked with trout for fishing, it is currently illegal to enter the water or swim from town-owned protected land.</p>

<p>Pond FF2 is located in Sudbury opposite the railroad tracks and town line from White Pond. It is located on private land immediately adjacent to the proposed Bruce Freeman Rail Trail.</p>

<p>Pond FF8 is comprised two connected ponds separated by a driveway located entirely on a private land on the northern side of North Road (Route 117), west of Frost Farm. Although located immediately adjacent to the proposed rail trail, visitors are not welcome and are greeted with numerous no trespassing signs.</p>

<p>Pond FF18 is comprised two farm ponds connected by an underground culvert and separated by an open field. Both are located entirely on a private land on the northwestern side of Concord Road adjacent to the Pantry Brook Wildlife Management Area. The neighboring property to the south is a horse farm. The east pond (top) is a small body of water encased on all sides by dense overgrowth, well hidden from view. The west pond is a bit larger and immediately adjacent to the farm field.</p>

<p>Pond FF32 is a town-owned pond to the east of the Peter Noyes Elementary School and west of the Piper Conservation Area. Photographed in late fall 2007, the pond was dry.</p>	

<b>Pond FF33 (South)</b>	
<p>Pond 33 is located in Sudbury Center, just south of Old Sudbury Road (Route 27), to the east of the Methodist Church. The pond has no apparent outlet</p>	
<b>Pond FF33 (North)</b>	
<p>Pond FF33-North adjacent to the north side of Concord Road opposite the street from Pantry Brook. At a low point in the road, this pond contributes to flooding of Concord Road every few years with high levels of spring rain, as occurred in 2006 and 2007. This pond is located between two farm fields and drains over the road to stream on the south side; perhaps indicating that a drainage culvert is damaged or clogged.</p>	
<b>Pond FF34</b>	
<p>Pond FF34 is located at the bend in Concord Road on the north side opposite Frost Lane. This pond is also located between two farm fields but appears to have no outlet. Well hidden by dense overgrowth on all sides, trail markers placed alongside this pond in the 1970s by Mike Meixell (sp?) are still posted on trees. The hiking trail connecting through to Davis Farm is in disrepair.</p>	
<b>Pond FF35</b>	

<b>Pond FF36</b>	
<p>Located on Town conservation land behind houses along Frost Lane, FF36 is apparently manmade for agricultural purposes. Adjacent farms fields are wet areas no longer in cultivation but mowed annually in the fall. It is not clear if the Town or abutting residents mow these fields. The author skated on this pond during the winter of 2006-2007.</p>
