### Prescription Medication Assistance

*The cost of prescriptions can be a financial burden for many. Below is a list of resources to reduce the out of pocket cost of prescription medications.*

- **Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (MCPHS) Pharmacy Outreach Program**
  - A community program run by the school that provides free help with medication information and understanding prescription drug coverage.
  - Provides information that may reduce the cost of medication through resources such as state and federal assistance, pharmaceutical company programs and special generic drug pricing.
  - Provides Medication Therapy Management (MTM) services to both patients and healthcare professionals.
  - Helps you to understand your Medicare prescription drug plan benefit.
  - Medication assistance options for uninsured or underinsured residents of Massachusetts.

- **Needy Meds**
  - A nonprofit organization working to provide people with information and resources to help find affordable healthcare.
  - Needy Meds Drug Discount Card App
    - A free app for either iPhone or Android that provides savings on medications as well as information on drug prices.
    - Accepted at over 65,000 pharmacies and no fees or registration.
  - \$4 Generic Discount Drug Programs
    - Needy Meds has a searchable database to help find pharmacies with generic drug programs. You can search by state, drug, or specific store.

- **Rx Outreach**
  - A fully licensed, nonprofit mail-order pharmacy seeking to provide affordable medications.
  - Patients must check eligibility requirements but *can* be on Medicare, Medicaid or other health insurance to qualify.

- **Prescription Advantage Massachusetts**

- A state-sponsored prescription drug program for seniors and people with disabilities.
- Helps cover the cost of prescription medications.
- Must meet certain eligibility requirements.

- **WellRx**

- A website that provides discounts on prescriptions and medication information via databases, organizational tools and a discount card.
- ScriptSave WellRx Program
  - Provides a prescription savings card that offers instant savings at the register on both brand name and generic prescription medication. The card can be applied to everyone in your household, including your pets.
  - No enrollment fee and no limits on usage.
  - A pharmacy discount network of 62,000 participating pharmacies across the county including chain and independent retail pharmacies.

- **GoodRx**

- A website that provides medication price comparisons, coupons and discounts for a wide range of drugs and locations.
- A database of over 60,000 pharmacies used to compare drug prices.
- Printable and digital coupons sent to your phone and email.

- **Partnership for Prescription Assistance**

- A free program sponsored by drug companies, doctors, patient advocacy organizations, and civic groups that helps low-income, uninsured patients get free or low-cost, brand-name medications.
