The Freedom Center is committed to the flourishing of individuals who have been impacted by human trafficking in San Diego and beyond.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES AND WORK:

The Freedom Center is estimated to open November 2022. The 4,000 square foot facility will include an intake room, counseling rooms, and various spaces to meet the holistic needs of trafficking survivors. Freedom Center staff will be available 24/7, providing food, shelter, and clothing along with services such as trauma-informed mental health treatment and job training. Case managers will also be available to connect survivors with medical, legal, and educational resources.
