- 10 Will you seek to be faithful and diligent in the exercise of all your duties as a Ruling Elder/Deacon/Trustee whether personal or relative, private or public, and to endeavor by the grace of God to adorn the profession of the gospel in your manner of life, and to walk with exemplary piety before this congregation of which God will make you an officer?
- 11 Are you now willing to take responsibility in the life of this congregation as a Ruling Elder/Deacon/Trustee and will you seek to discharge your duties, relying upon the grace of God, in such a way that the entire Church of Jesus Christ will be blessed?
