WORDS FOR REFLECTION

"When Jesus, praying on a mountaintop, was transfigured in the presence of Peter, James, and John, they saw Moses and Elijah with Him. Moses had heard the voice of God on the top of Sinai; later, Elijah had been brought to that same mountain to hear God speak, not in the fire and the tempest, but in the quiet whisper of God's sovereign word. The cloud of glory that had surrounded Moses on Sinai again enveloped Jesus and His disciples. God's voice again spoke from the cloud. But God did not proclaim another ten commandments to be added to the words of His covenant of old. Rather, the voice from the cloud said, 'This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him' (Luke 9.35)."
