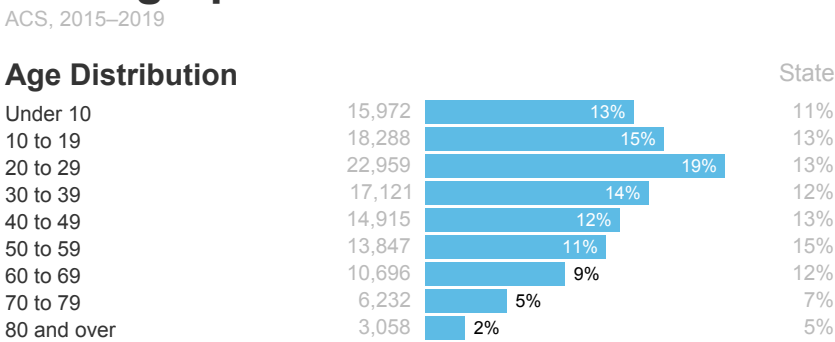

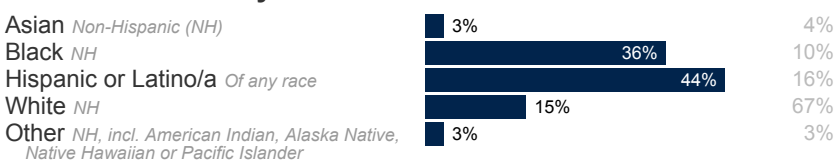

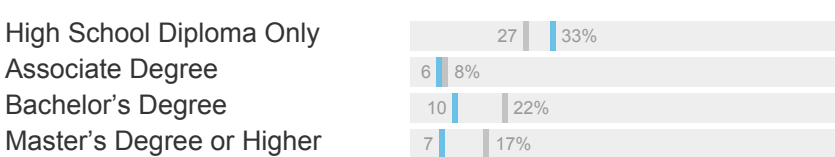
Race and Ethnicity



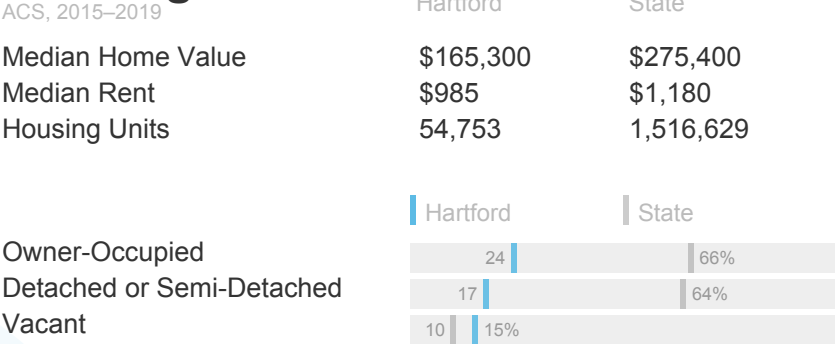

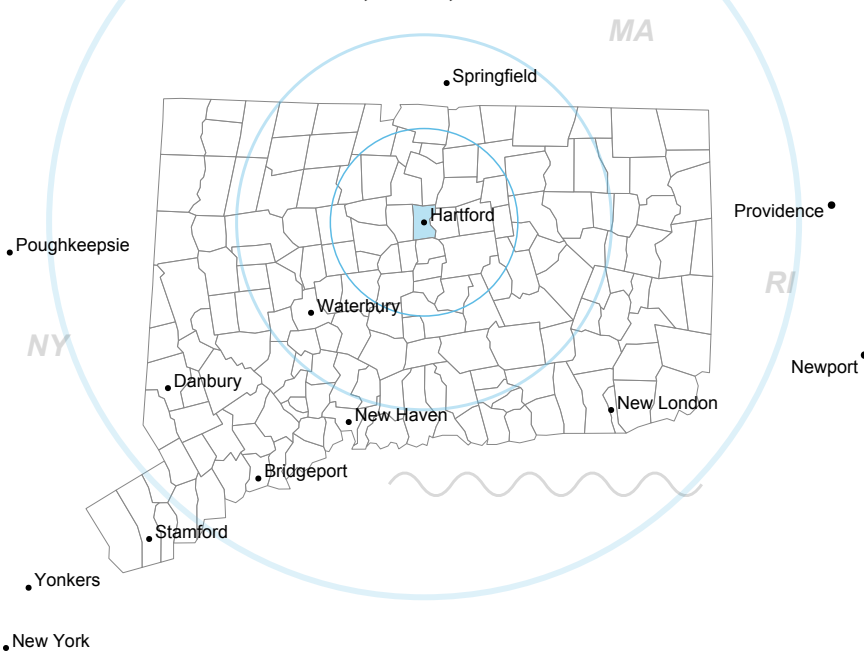
