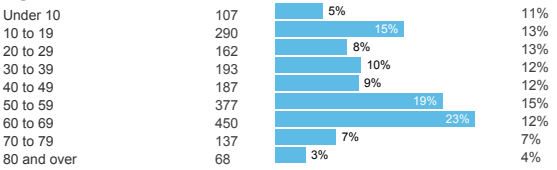

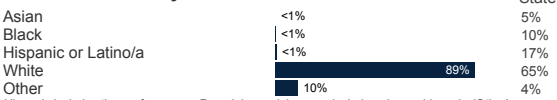

Race and Ethnicity

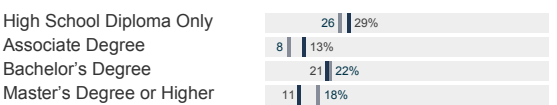

Language Spoken at Home



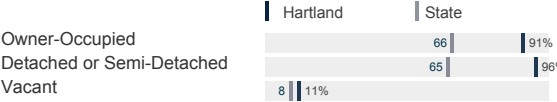

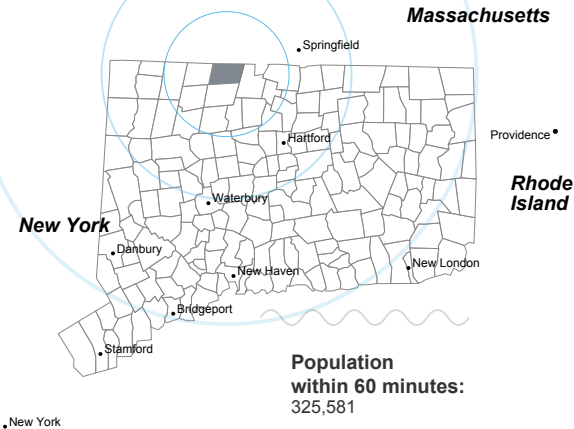
Unemployment Rate
