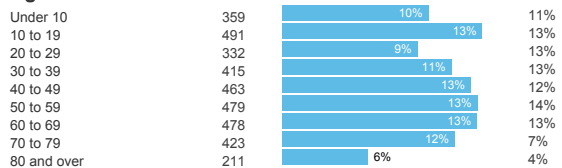

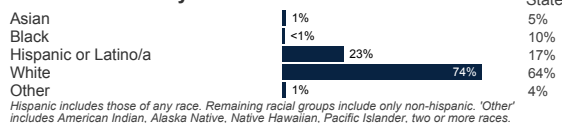

Age Distribution



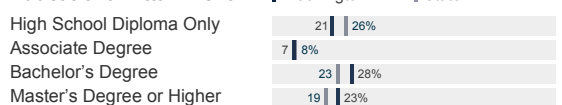
Race and Ethnicity



Language Spoken at Home



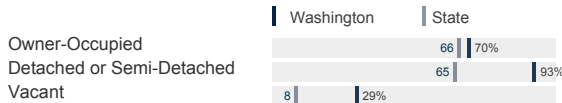

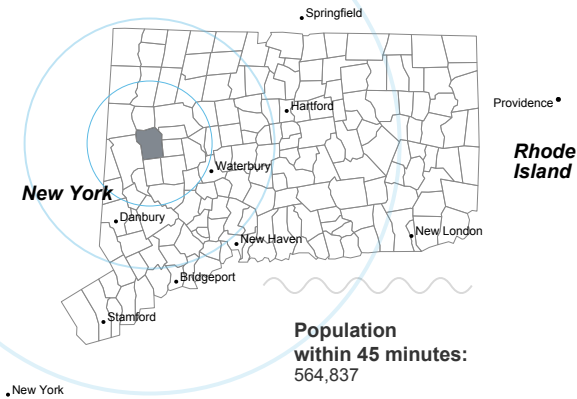
Self-Employment Rate*
