## Matthew 28:16-20

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the

Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

## Matthew 28:18-20

And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. **Go** therefore and **make disciples** of all nations, **baptizing** them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **teaching** them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

## Acts 11:25-26

So Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. For a whole year they met with the church and taught a great many people. And in Antioch the **disciples** were first called **Christians**.

## Acts 14:21-22

When they had preached the gospel to that city and had **made many disciples**, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God.

## Acts 2:38

And Peter said to them, “Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ *eis* the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

*Can be translated “at, because of, as a result of”*

The men of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for they repented *eis* the preaching of Jonah, and behold, something greater than Jonah is here.

*They repented “at/ because of/ as a result of” Jonah’s preaching.*

## Acts 2:37

Now when they heard this **they were cut to the heart**, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, “Brothers, what shall we do?”

## Acts 2:41

So those who **received his word** were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

Acts 2:21

And it shall come to pass that **everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.**'

Acts 8:12-13

But when **they believed** Philip as he preached **good news** about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women. Even Simon himself believed, and after being baptized he continued with Philip.

Acts 10:43

To him all the prophets bear witness that **everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins** through his name.”

## Acts 13:38-39

Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by **him everyone who believes is freed** from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses.

## Acts 15:9

and he made no distinction between us and them, having **cleansed their hearts by faith.**

## Acts 16:30-31

“Sirs, what must I do to be saved?” And they said, **“Believe in the Lord Jesus,** and you will be saved, you and your household.”

## Acts 20:20-21

how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house to house, testifying both to Jews and to Greeks of **repentance toward God and of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.**

## Acts 8:9-12

But there was a man named Simon, who had previously practiced magic in the city and amazed the people of Samaria, saying that he himself was somebody great. They all paid attention to him, from the least to the greatest, saying, “This man is the power of God that is called Great.” And they paid attention to him because for a long time he had amazed them with his magic. But when **they believed** Philip as he preached good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, **they were baptized**, both men and women.

Acts 9:18

And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and he regained his sight. **Then he rose and was baptized**

Acts 16:14-15


One who heard us was a woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira...who was a worshiper of God. The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what was said by Paul. **And after she was baptized**

Acts 18:8

Crispus, the ruler of the synagogue, believed in the Lord, together with his entire household. **And many** of the Corinthians hearing Paul **believed and were baptized.**

The New Testament has no concept of an unbaptized Christian. When people repented and believed in Christ, they were baptized—often immediately—as a public profession of their faith and to identify with the body of believers.



## Romans 6:3-4



1 Corinthians 1:30

And **because of him you are in Christ**

Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God,  
righteousness and sanctification and  
redemption,

**“in Christ”** used **82 times** as in

2 Corinthians 5:17

Therefore, if anyone is **in Christ**, he is  
a new creation.

**“in him”** occurs **20 times** as in

Ephesians 1:7

**In him** we have redemption through his  
blood

**“with Christ”** used **12 times** as in

Colossians 3:3

For you have died, and your life is hidden **with Christ** in God.

**“with him”** occurs **12 times** as in

2 Timothy 2:11

The saying is trustworthy, for: If we have died **with him**, we will also live **with him**;

The Lord led me into the knowledge of the mystery of union with Christ, that I was joined to him, that I was bone of his bone and flesh of his flesh. By this also my faith in him as my righteousness was the more confirmed for if he and I were one, then his righteousness was mine, his merits mine, his victory also mine.

## Romans 6:3-4

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were **baptized into his death**? We were **buried therefore with him** by **baptism into death**, in order that, just as **Christ was raised** from the dead by the glory of the Father, **we too might walk in newness of life.**

The essential point Paul is making is that being a Christian involves a personal, vital identification with Jesus Christ, and that this union with him is dramatically set forth in our baptism.
