## THE PERFECT FOLLOW-UP PLAN

For Church Guests







Have you ever said this?
"We've got people
coming in the front door
and ... heading right back
out the back door!"

This has to be one of the most frustrating parts of ministry, and if you want the church to grow, then you have to figure out how to close that back door.

## The question is... HOW?

Here are the two primary things you need to have in place for guests to WANT to come back to your church.

- You need to create the very best experience for the guest.
- You need an airtight and consistent, stepbystep process to follow up with every guest.

**NOTE:** Both of these must be in place to see growth. For example, if the guest experience on Sunday is less than it should be, all the followup in the world won't fully help your guest retention.

When the weekend experience is functioning at the highest level for your guests, adhering to this follow-up plan will help you see more guests return week after week.



## THE PERFECT FOLLOW-UP PLAN

For Church Guests

- 1 Wait 0 days (Sunday afternoon) Send thank you text message for coming.
- Wait 1 day (Monday AM)
  Send welcome email and guest experience survey.
- Wait 2 days (Tuesday)

  Deliver cookies to them
  home or send prepackaged brownies or goodies
  to arrive by Saturday.
- Wait 6 days (Saturday AM)
  Send email invite back to
  Sunday service.
- Send text message invite back to Sunday service.



- Send email invite to next

  "Welcome Dinner" and
  links to a couple of your
  church's popular sermons.

  \* "Welcome Dinner" is a
  dinner specifically geared
  toward guests.
- Wait 13 days (Saturday AM) Send invite email back to Sunday service.
- Wait 20 days (Saturday)
  Send invite text message
  back to Sunday service.
- Wait 24 days (Wednesday)
  Send "Do you have any
  questions about
  the church?" / "How can
  we help?" email
- Wait 52 days (Wednesday)
  Send Week 8 followup
  email which can include
  the following: invite to
  Sunday service and/or
  other upcoming events,
  links to resources of the
  church, and invite to next
  "Welcome Dinner" (if they
  did not previously attend).



When the church's leadership remains dependent on God through this process, adhering to this followup plan for guests will help your church grow.
