

The international, multidisciplinary *Journal of Learning Disabilities* (JLD) publishes articles on practice, research, and theory related to learning disabilities (LD). Published bimonthly.

### Types of Manuscripts

JLD encourages the submission of quantitative and qualitative manuscripts of different orientations (e.g., ethnographic, interpretative, narrative, voices). Three major types of manuscripts are typically accepted by the journal. In all categories, **tables and figures are included in page limitations**.

**Research articles** are data-based manuscripts reporting original research that includes students with or at risk for learning disabilities. Authors are encouraged to clarify if a study is part of a larger study or is a replication. Intervention designs should meet recommendations as outlined by the What Works Clearinghouse and be consistent with the quality indicators highlighted in the special issue of *Exceptional Children* 71:2 (Jan. 2005). It is particularly important to clearly describe participants with or at risk for learning disabilities and to include implications and directions for future research for this diverse population. *Length: 30–35* typewritten, double-spaced pages.

**Extensive literature reviews, theoretical papers, or nonempirical position or policy papers** are selected based on the content's importance to the field of learning disabilities. *Length: 30–35* typewritten, double-spaced pages.

A **special series or section** contains several different articles by various authors on a given topic. A lead author with extensive experience and expertise in a specific area conceptualizes and coordinates it. Individuals who wish to guest edit a special series should first contact the journal editorial office to ascertain interest in the topic.

**Letters to the editor** involving reaction to material appearing in JLD or to an issue in the field of LD are encouraged and are published as space permits. *Length: no more than 3* double-spaced, typewritten pages. No tables, figures, or footnotes. Letters are subject to editing and condensation by the editorial staff.

**Manuscript page counts for each type should include abstract, references, tables, and figures, and each table should start on a new page.**

### Acceptance Criteria

Initial consideration of a manuscript will depend upon (a) content relevance and usefulness to the readership; (b) how it compares to other articles dealing with similar content on pertinent variables (e.g., sample size, research design, research quality, literature review); (c) clarity of writing style; and (d) the author's adherence to APA guidelines.

### Manuscript Preparation

Follow guidelines specified in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (7th ed., 2020)*. JLD follows a masked review process; authors must ensure submitted manuscripts do not divulge identity. For example, never use first person (I, my, we, our) when doing so reveals the authors' identities (e.g., "in our larger study, Smith et al., 2016 found ..."). Instead, use *Authors et al.* References to the authors' work should be in third person (e.g., "Smith et al. (2016) cautioned that ...").

1. **Title Page.** Submit a **separate title page file** with (a) article title; (b) names of all authors; (c) author affiliations, complete mailing address for contact author, e-mail addresses of all authors; and (d) any acknowledgments; financial, preregistration, or preprint disclosure information; author notes; or other text that could identify authors to reviewers. **Please do not include any links to a preprint or unblinded preregistration within the manuscript.**
2. **Format.** 8½ × 11 in. document; 1-in. margins; double-spacing, left alignment, Times New Roman, 12-pt. type for text. Include title & abstract. **Text and table files must be Word documents; no PDFs.**
3. **Tables.** Each table should start on a new page. **Tables should be double-spaced; please use Word's table functions and save as text. Do not save tables as pictures.**

4. **Endnotes.** Use endnotes sparingly. Number with Arabic numerals starting with 1 and continuing through the article. Example: (see Note 1). NO footnotes.
5. **References.** Provide DOIs (preferred) for reference entries or URLs (see APA 7th, pp. 298–299, for guidance).

**Authors for Whom English is a Second Language.** It is highly recommended to have a colleague or copyeditor who is fluent in English review the manuscript before submission.

**Figures.** Figures should be separate files—with each figure on a new page or file—must be **black and white only**, and be production-ready. Use bold type that is large enough to be reduced and still be readable, and make sure rules/tick marks are at least 1 pt. Acceptable electronic formats include: TIFF, EPS, Word, or Excel. For scans/photos, download the SAGE Image Resolution Guidelines from the Instructions & Forms link at <https://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/jld>.

**Permissions.** The author is responsible for obtaining written permission for material (e.g., figures, tables, extensive quotes) taken directly or adapted from another source. Payment of any fees the copyright holder may require is also the author's responsibility. Permissions often take a considerable amount of time to be granted, so start the request process early. **Material taken from software or from the Internet also requires obtaining permission.** Download a *Permissions Request* form from the *Instructions & Forms* link at <https://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/jld>. Read permissions carefully to ensure the language is broad enough to allow publication in all formats, including electronic and print. Failure to obtain permission will result in removal of the item or the article.

**Supplemental Material.** Decisions regarding inclusion of supplemental material will be made by the editor as part of the article acceptance process. With the exception of videos and podcasts, supplemental files will be deposited to Figshare and assigned a DOI. Authors are responsible for the scientific accuracy and file functionality of all supplemental files; materials will **not** be copyedited, typeset, or proofread. ### Manuscript Submission

Submit electronically: <https://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/jld>

Log in, or click the "Create an Account" option in blue bar at upper right if you are a first-time user. Once logged in, click on "Author." Have the following available before starting submission: manuscript files, including separate title page; all coauthors' full names and e-mail addresses; # of figures, # of tables, # of manuscript pages. Click the "Start New Submission" link in box at left (if 1st time submitting the manuscript) and follow the submission steps. A guide is available via the Help button at top right in blue bar. Although not required, we strongly suggest authors indicate their ORCID ID or create one.

**Letter:** As part of the submission process, you will need to include a cover letter, either as an attachment or copied and pasted into the Cover Letter box provided. The letter should include information on prior dissemination of the findings at conferences or on social media.

**PLEASE NOTE** that manuscripts not conforming to these guidelines may be returned without external review.
