Reflections on Readings for The Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Is It My Way That Is Unfair, Or Rather, Are Not Your Ways Unfair?"

Our readings this Sunday continue the theme of the past several weeks of the boundless mercy and forgiveness of God. Often, this mercy is contrary to our sense of fairness. We humans tend to see life in the strata of merit—the longer you are good, the better you are, the more you deserve God's mercy. God holds out His hand of mercy to everyone, even at the "11th hour".



In our first reading ([Ezekiel 18:25-28](#)), the prophet Ezekiel stressed personal responsibility for one's actions. If one led an exemplary life but then turned toward evil ways, "he shall perish." Yet the Lord rejoices in those who turn from their evil ways, even at the last minute, "he shall surely live." This often offends our sensibilities and sense of fairness, but not God's.

In our Epistle reading ([Philippians 2:1-11](#)), St. Paul offers a plea for unity and humility. It is Jesus' example and teaching that we should follow. Jesus gives us an example of humility and obedience, "He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave and found human in appearance . . . accepting death, even death on a cross". It is this "same attitude" that we should aspire to. St. Paul teaches us to "humbly regard others as more important than yourselves". Imagine what our world would be like if everyone heeded St. Paul's words in today's Epistle.

In our Gospel reading ([Matthew 21:28-32](#)), we hear the Parable of the Two Sons. This parable reminds us that our actions speak much louder than our words. Jesus was speaking to the chief priests and the elders in the synagogue. They were the ones who talked a good game but when they had the opportunity to turn from their evil ways and do good, they refused. Yet, the tax collectors and prostitutes repented after hearing John the Baptist and were saved. Even after seeing this, the chief priests and elders "did not change their minds and believe Him."

Often, we "will the good of the other" only when it suits us, when the other person is like us, behaves like us, looks like us. God wills everyone's good, always, even and especially when we turn away from Him. God rejoices when we turn back from our evil ways and do what is right. Should we not be of "the same attitude" as Christ? Should we not heed St. Paul's words to "humbly regard others as more important than yourselves?"

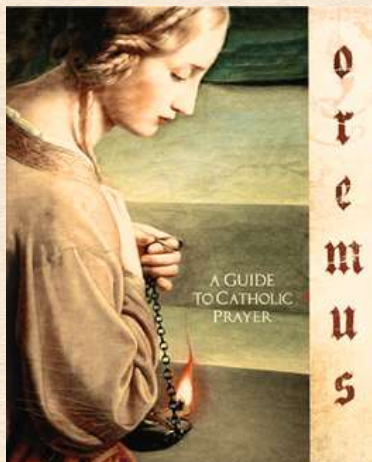

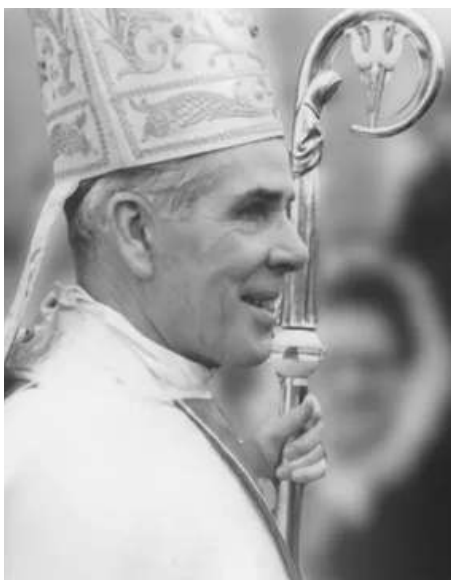

Many of us know that Bishop Fulton Sheen was beatified on September 24 in St. Louis, Missouri. A first-class relic of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, who led the Rochester Diocese as its sixth bishop (1966-69), is being gifted to the Diocese of Rochester by Archbishop Sheen's native Diocese of Peoria, Illinois.

During a Sept. 29 Mass at Rochester's Sacred Heart Cathedral, Bishop Louis Tylka of Peoria will formally present the relic to Bishop John S. Bonnici. The Mass is being celebrated five days after Archbishop Sheen's beatification in St. Louis, Missouri.

Mass at Sacred Heart Cathedral will begin at 7 p.m. on September 29th, and all are welcome to attend.

The Sept. 29 Mass will be followed by a series of related liturgies at several diocesan parishes this fall. At these Masses, the faithful will have opportunities to view and venerate the relic — a small portion of Archbishop Sheen's remains — before it is placed on permanent display at the cathedral for further viewing and veneration.

All liturgies will begin at 7 p.m. with Bishop Bonnici presiding.

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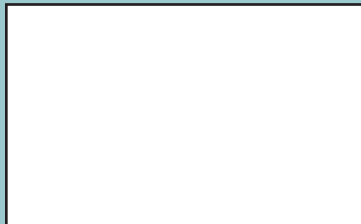
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
