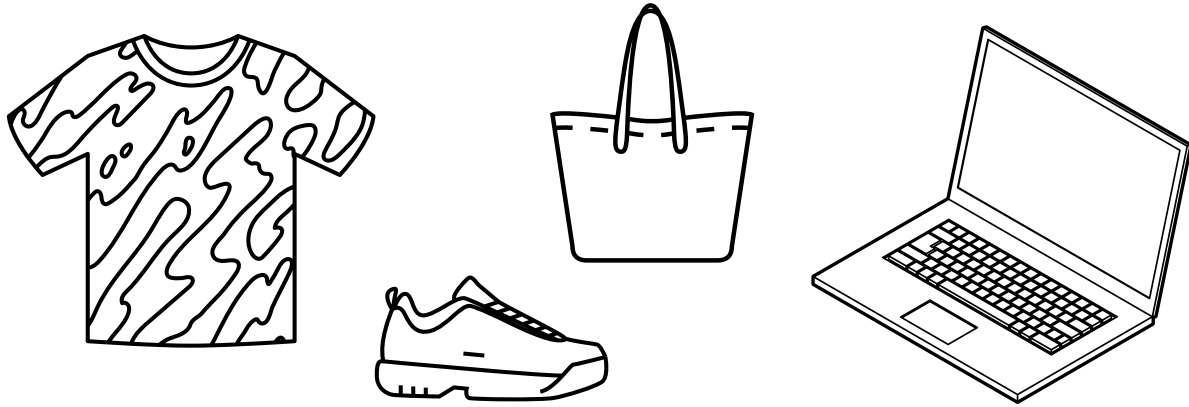

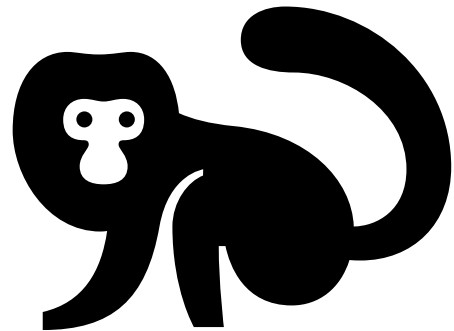
COLOR MY CLUTTER

- Squirrel-sized monkey
- Lives in southeastern coastal Brazil
- Critically endangered—only 1,500 left
- Eat insects, lizards and fruit
- Weigh less than 2 pounds
- Can live up to 31 years
- Less than 2% of their habitat remains
