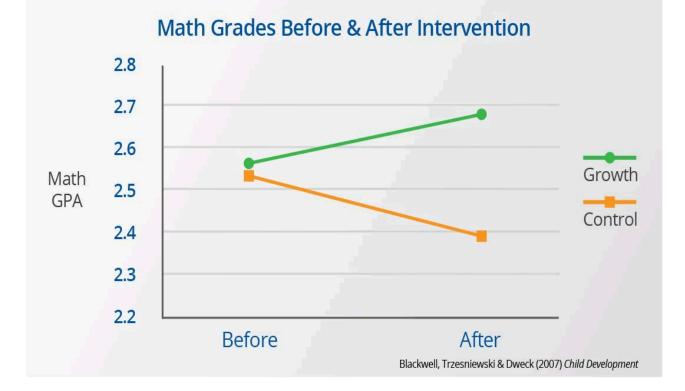

"People believe... their talents and abilities can be developed through passion, education, and persistence.

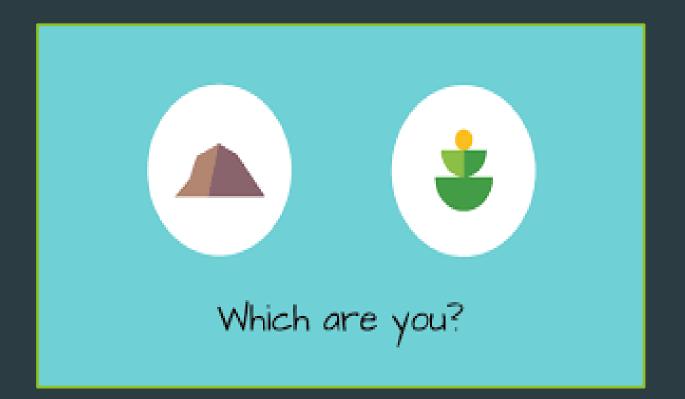
