





# SUNY Guided Pathways Project Goals

Support significant institution-wide change involving guided pathways at scale for all credit students.



# Pathway design and implementation will involve:



- curriculum alignment and program mapping, aligned both to university transfer programs and to the labor market
- reconfiguration of developmental education as an accelerated and contextualized onramp to programs of study
- ongoing advising and monitoring of student progress
- integrated academic support and student services
- integrated approaches to hands-on application of learning
- and alignment of co-curricular learning

Develop associated planning and execution of college-wide engagement in pathway design and implementation by:

- engaging and timely professional development for faculty, staff, and administrators.
- holding at least one college-wide convening in support of full campus engagement.

Develop institute team membership with composition varying depending on the topic of each institute.



- Over the series of institutes, team membership will typically include:
  - President
  - faculty governing board chair
  - chief academic officer
  - chief student services officer
  - institutional researcher
  - faculty leaders
  - counselors/advisors
  - other college personnel who will be key to the pathway design and implementation work on campus
- Experience demonstrates that the composition of the team is important for effecting meaningful change on campus; and the active, visible leadership of the CEO is critical.

As a campus receiving SUNY Performance Improvement Funding you are expected to:

- engage with the other campuses in your community of practice
- produce progress reports at the end of each academic semester (pre/post work)
- spend a portion of your award on faculty and staff professional development, including travel to relevant conferences and meetings
- complete project spending at the end of two years or meet other defined project deliverables in that time frame
- utilize State/SUNY contracts, and SUNY Shared Services when they are available



# Benefits of full participation

- the institute experiences
- the coaching and technical assistance provided during and between the institutes
- working with other colleges engaged in similarly challenging work
- the opportunity to contribute to building capacity for institutional change in the community college field

The ultimate beneficiaries are OUR students who will better progress to completion, transfer, and employment.



# Team Facilitator



- Co-facilitates coach's visit with Executive Lead
- Attends all five (5) SUNY Guided Pathways Institutes and presents if requested
- Ensures that the team is registered and that travel plans are coordinated for each institute
- Ensures all team paperwork and assignments are turned in by designated due dates
- Hosts webinar watch parties
- Serves as the point of contact for the college team
- Supports overall project management with Executive Lead, including budget
- Facilitates completion of pre and post-work assignments
- Reaches out across campus for input (pre and post-work, home team meetings, etc.)
- Collects, shares, and analyzes institutional data
- Facilitates implementation of faculty and student focus groups
- Manages Scale of Adoption Assessment
- Coordinates (institute and project) feedback, visits, and meetings with the college's coach

## Executive Lead

- College President or Chief Academic Officer
- Attends each of the five (5) institutes
- Secures buy-in from all areas of the college
- Finds resources to support guided pathways initiatives at your college
- Provides consistent senior leadership for your institution's team
